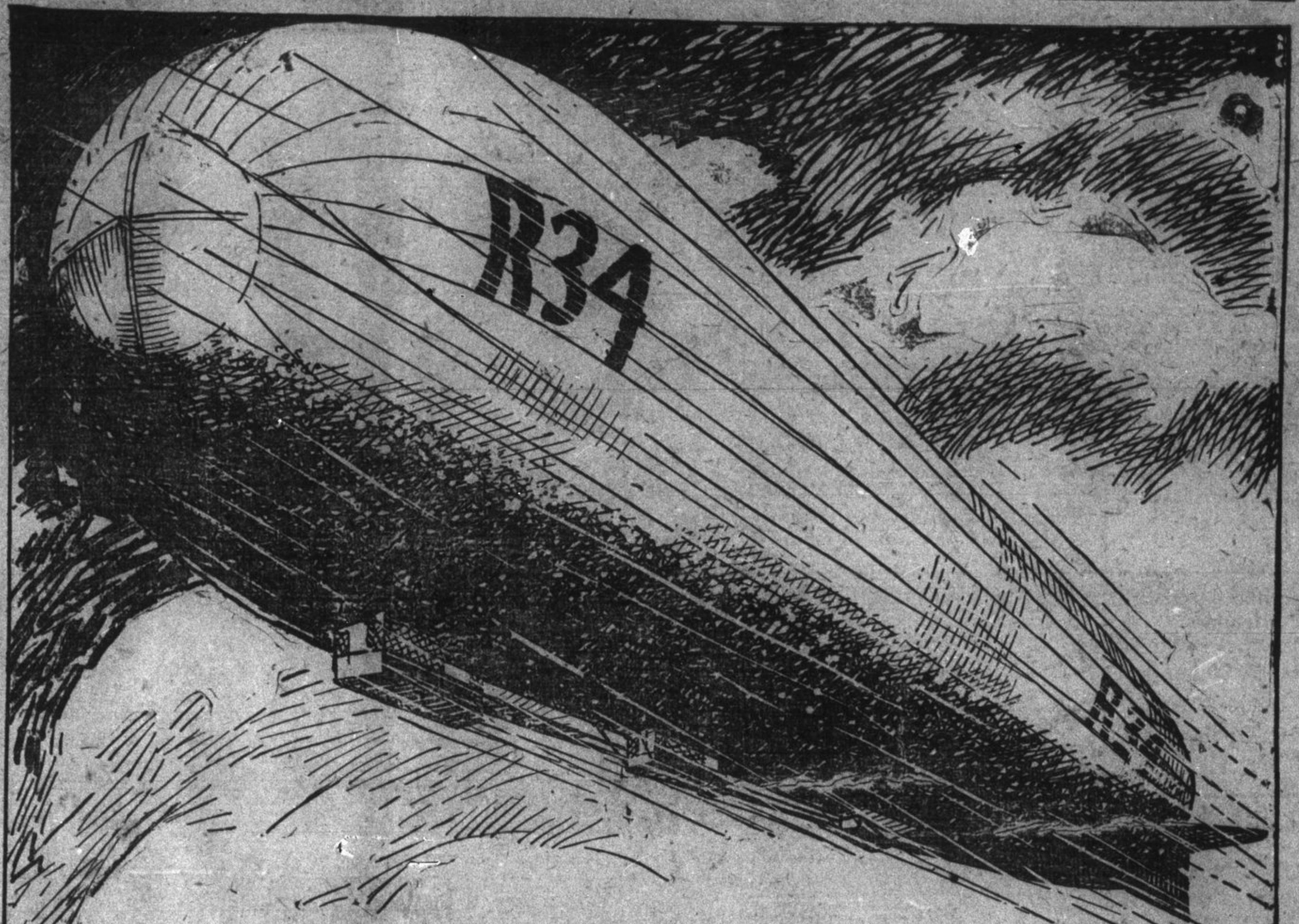
George Denyes Passed Away At St. Louis, Mo.
