MAJOR LOST HIS CHANCE**LOST FINALS OF CANADA MATCH
TO BELLEVILLE.**

Two Other Kingston Teams Eliminated—A Fine Showing for the Chief Magistrate.

R. J. Wray's Belleville rink was victorious Wednesday afternoon in the big feature of the annual tournament of the St. Lawrence Bowling Association, at Prescott, winning out in the final for the Wiser cup by a score of 14 to 12 over H. W. Newman, of Kingston.

The game, which attracted the largest gallery of the tournament, was keenly contested from start to finish. It was close all the way through and Newman, coming from behind, tied up the score on the 17th end. On the 18th end, however, Wray scored two and won out. The mayor and his rink made a splendid showing, nevertheless, and are to be congratulated for being clever enough to enter the finals.

The other two Kingston teams were eliminated from the rink competitions. In the second round of the Dominion match Dr. R. E.
