AND THEN AGAIN DEMPSEY MIGHT BRING THE GOLD TO AMERICA

Descamps, manager of Georges Carpentier, does not consider Joe Beckett, the new British heavyweight champion a match for the clever French boxer.

Descamps was at the ringside when Beckett recently knocked out Frank Goddard in a round and a half at the Olympian arena. After the fight he was asked if he believed Carpentier could defeat the new champion. He declared Carpentier most certainly could.

"I watched the fight very closely," said Descamps, "for I must tell Carpentier all about it, and all about Beckett. Carpentier is Beckett's superior. He will defeat Beckett when they meet in September and I'll tell you why."

"Both men entered the ring with the reputation of being hard hitters, but I failed to note a really good left hand punch, or a good right, for that matter, in all that Beckett did. Goddard failed to show his hitting powers also."

"There can be no doubt that Goddard was beaten by a better boxer, but not by a man who can tackle Carpentier. It makes a lot of difference when a man can miss blows like Beckett's hook for shilling his back a few inches. Here are more

reasons why Carpentier should beat Beckett:

"He is much quicker on his feet. He stands on his feet when delivering a punch. He has both a good left and good right hand. He is a much more clever boxer. He is cratter."

"In meeting Beckett, Carpentier would not have to be so anxious about Joe dashing out his left as he would if he was boxing Bambardier Wells, who has a very long reach, and whom Georges beat twice."

"Beckett's reach does not compare with that of Wells. Georges will not have to worry on this point, and besides he is a much better fighter than Beckett. He proved his ability at inflicting against Joe Jeannelle, the best American boxer America has sent to Europe and one of the cleverest big men in the states. Georges beat him round after round inflicting, and that when he was a mere boy. During the fight he downed Jeannelle with a single blow."

"I feel sure that Carpentier will defeat Beckett, retain his European title and bring back to France with him that handsome trophy the Gant gold cup. It will be one of the happiest days of my life."

Here's Hoping They'll Hit For The High Spots.

Two new players have been added to the Toronto Ball Club in an effort to win a third consecutive pennant. They are Frank Schultz, outfielder, until recently manager and right-fielder of the Binghamton team, and John Haddock, catcher, secured by purchase from the Binghamton club.

With the addition of these players several of the present men will have to be let out, so that the Toronto team can keep within the player limit. Breckenridge will probably be sent to the M. and O. or some other league, although President McCaffery stated some time ago that he would be taken care of for the remainder of the season, as he kept on playing for the Leafs for nearly three weeks when the team was badly crippled, although in no fit condition to play himself.

Schultz is a long-distance, left-hand hitter and has the range of the island bleachers, as he has made one home run there already this season.

Canadians Showed The Real Stuff.

Canada proved the quality of her sportsmanship to the rest of the world by offering to take on the best golf team that the United States had to send for an international prize, knowing at the time that her chance for success looked to be seven fifties to one.

Jack Dempsey, world's heavyweight champion, arrived in Chicago on Tuesday from Salt Lake City for an operation on his nose. According to Dempsey, he has been bothered by incorrect breathing for many months. The champion was besieged by promoters and others who want to put him in circuses, in the movies and on the stage. Jack Kearns, his manager, decided to wait a few days before considering the propositions.

BIG ENGLISH FIGHT MAY BE POSTPONED

Carpentier-Beckett Bout May Not Take Place in September.

The Carpentier-Beckett heavyweight bout appeared to-day to be indefinitely postponed, with a possibility it may not be staged before the first of next year.

Inability of Promoter Cochran to rent Olympia Albert Hall on any suitable date after September 2nd, and the reluctance of French authorities to allow Carpentier to leave France before then, was the reason given.

Cochran has planned to go to Paris,

where he will make an effort to induce French authorities to change their minds regarding the battle. It is understood that Socialist deputies have brought strong pressure to bear on Premier Clemenceau to keep Carpentier from making the trip to England. They point out that whereas Carpentier is able to accumulate several thousand dollars in a single night, French workmen are struggling hard to overcome the poverty left by the war.

Cochran hopes to substitute Eddis McGorty, the American high-heavyweight, in case he is unable to bring Carpentier over. There is no chance that Fred Fulton will be chosen in place of the French champion, Beckett's manager wisely sidestepped the match by declaring his boxer was not getting Jack Dempsey's title.

More Prizes for Golfers. Such a splendid number of entries has been received at Hamilton that the Royal Canadian Golf Association have announced that they are enabled to increase the prizes as follows: first, \$200 and a gold medal; second, \$150 and a silver medal; third, \$100; fourth, \$50; fifth, \$20 and sixth, \$10.

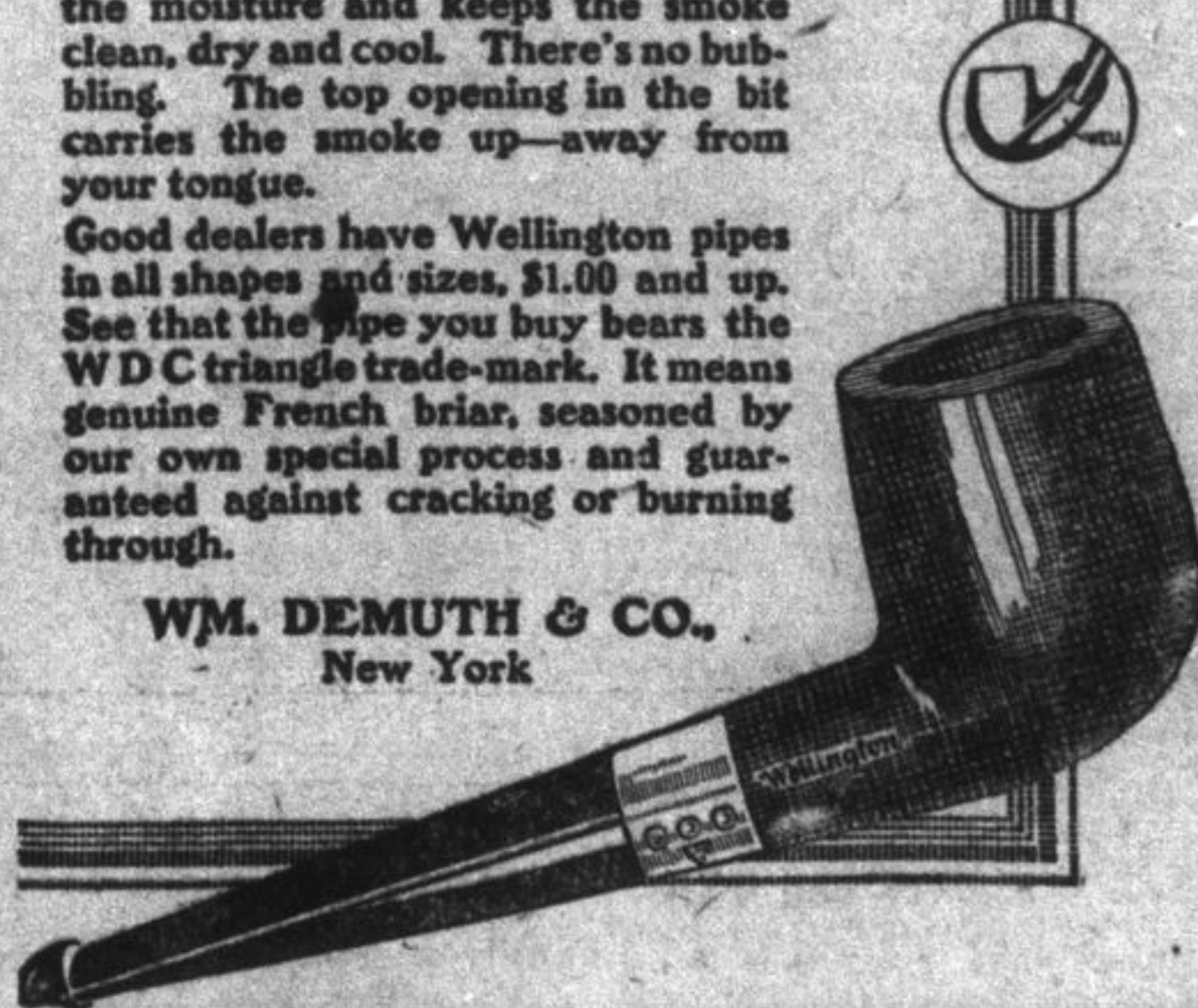
