

PASSED AWAY ON MONDAY

IOHN HALLIDAY, CUSHENDALL, SUFFERED A FRACTURED

He Was Thrown From a Rig While Driving on the Gananoque Road, Six Miles from the City.

Unconscious to the last, John Hal-liday, Cushendall, who was thrown from his rig by a runaway horse on Monday night, passed away at the Hotel Dieu six hours after his admission. The deceased was driving to the city with Mrs. Foster, also of lawn which sweeps from the street Cushendall, and on the Gananoque to the lake front. Besides the house road, six miles from Kingston, the horse took fright and ran away, overturning the rig.
