The additional consumers taken on in 1914 and 1915 warranted the installation of additional manufacturing equipment, but in a general way, all industrial appliances of this nature were side-tracked in the one great endeavor to win the war, and the prices which we received for new machinery at this time would not justify the expenditure.

During the last few years, the Commission, with a much over-taxed plant, endeavored to furnish a supply as best they could under existing conditions until the steel and iron market became normal.

Contracts are to-day in the hands of the Manufacturers for new Purifiers and Generators, capable of supplying a continuous service and every expediency will be brought to bear to have these various machines erected with the least possible delay.

In the meantime, we sincerely trust you will bear patiently with us in our endeavor to furnish the best supply possible under our very much crippled condition.

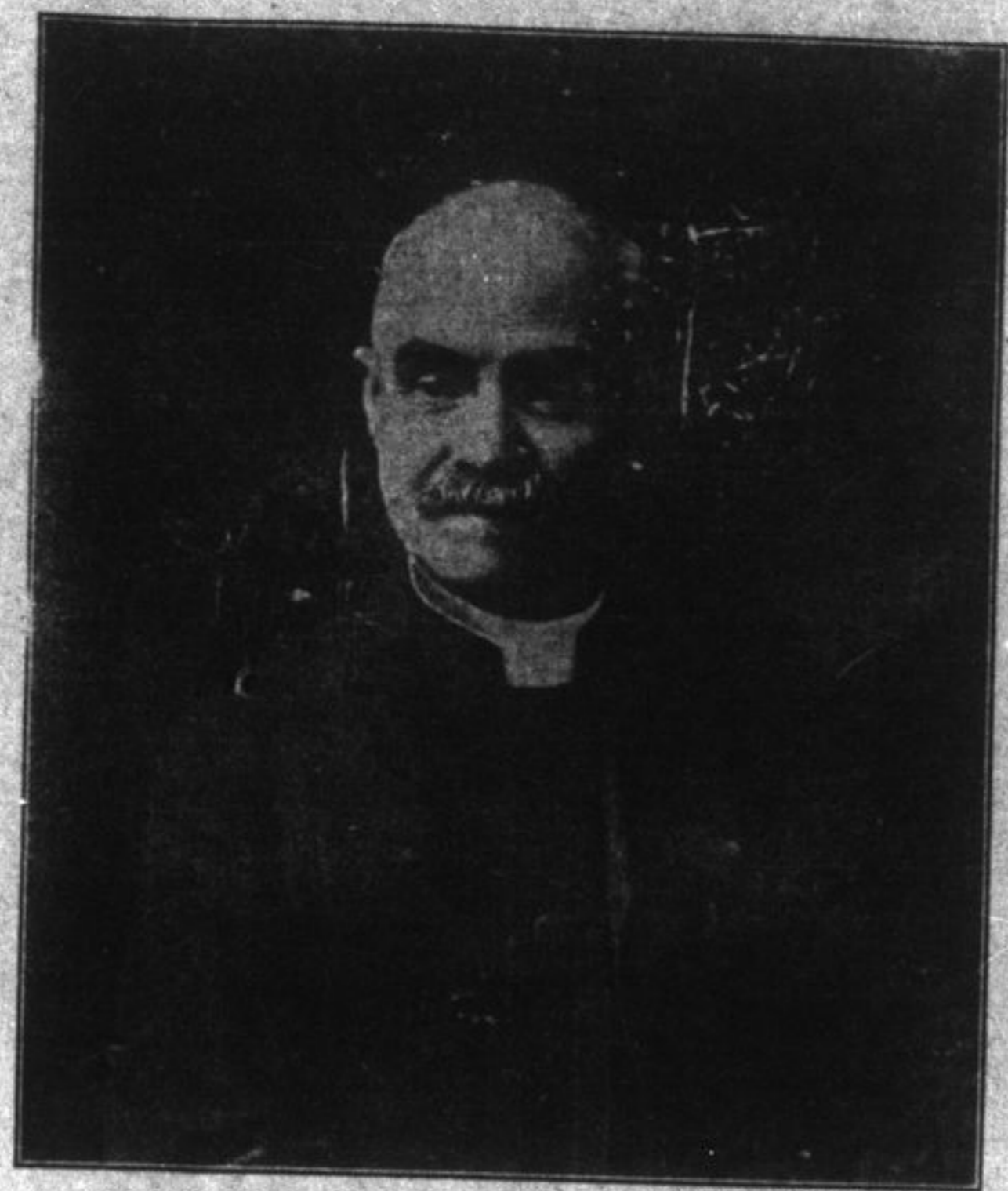
