

Originally held by the state with all other northern New York property, it was not included in the original grant to Macomb, the boundary question not having been determined between the United States and Canada, Dec. 11th, 1828, the state granted a patent to Elisha Camp. conveying title to the greater part of the islands in the St. Lawrence and Hart Island was included. For many years it was carried on the records as Hemlock Island, and was so known when purchased by Kirke Hart, of Albion. N.Y., from the Azarish Walton estate in 1871. took the name of Hart Island from nurchased by Mrs. Louise A. Boldt from Edward W. Dewey, of New York, on July 1st. 1895. According to the deed, as recorded in the county clerk's office, the 'sland contains about three acres . . The Boldt castle was started about 1900.
