Dr. J. T. M. Anderson was a short time ago appointed director of education for new Canadians in Saskatchewan, and with the endorsation of the Provincial Department of Education is now initiating a policy that aims at giving to every child of non-English parentage a training necessary for good Canadian citizenship. The instruction is to be given by Canadian teachers, and under conditions much more favorable than have obtained heretofore.

It used to be more than a year's salary made up for to live as the teachers in the average foreignspeaking community out West had to live. There was in many cases nothing for them to do but to go a-boarding with some of the funny-named people whose children they taught by day, and in whose bad-smelling houses they slept at night. Non-English hosts and hostesses were frequently persons of excellent intentions, who did the best they could for the schoolma'ams, but the results were seldom entirely happy, and as a natural consequence school districts of this kind were avoided. It is now proposed, however, to supply comfortable cottages in which the teachers are to keep house for themselves. To live among the immigrant settlers isn't so bad when one hasn't to live with them.

A similar plan is being put into effect in Alberta also. The Department of Education in that province will prepare plans for small residences for teachers, and will pay oncthird of the cost of construction if the building is of a value of not less than \$1,000. The local school district must do the rest. Married men will then be sent as principals of these schools, taking their families with them to the school residences, and boarding the assistant teachers as a matter of mutual accommodation. This housing feature will not be compulsory, but will be introduced where local circumstances make jt advis-

Both in Saskatchewan and Alberta the new plans of the Education Departments involve a wider use of the school building as a centre of community life and betterment. In the halls for lectures, concerts, and such like. A grant of fifty per cent. of the cost of equipment for movable and adjustable seats will be made to each rural school district, up to a maximum of \$250, and in this way it is hoped to encourage the country people to use their schools as real centres of social welfare.

Saskatchewan will try the plan of stocking some of its schools in non-English communities with newspapers and magazines. Grafanolas will also be recommended to the trustees as a means of cultivating the children's taste for good music and oratory, and wherever practicable sewing machines will be installed for the girls. Libraries will be establishin the foreign schools of Manitoba by the Daughters of the Empire, as war

The three ostrich plumes are the badge of the Heir Apparent to the throne of England. The ostrich nsignia altogether.

The popular belief is that the ostrich feathers were won from Philip of Valois at the Battle of Crecy when the Black Prince so gallantly served his father Edward III and his country by defeating the

An authority on heraldry, Charles Boutell, maintains that there is no foundation for the belief that the feathers were won from King Philip. of Valois. The theory, he says, is not supported by any contemporary. The first time the feathers are mentioned in any record is in a document which was dated A.D. 1369.

In 1369 the three feathers were grouped together by Arthur Tudor, Prince of Wales, eldest son of Henry VII. The plumes appear to have been encircled for the first time with coronet by Prince Edward who afterwards became King Edward VI. but who never really was Prince of

Edward lil used the ostrich feathers as a badge with his shield of arms, and the feathers were also used by Queen Phillipia, his wife, as heraldic device in 1370. The ostrich feathers appear on some, but not on all seals of the Black Prince and were omitted from some



PRINCE OF WALES' CREST. of his seals after the Battle of Crecy. The feathers were also used by all the other sons of Edward III., but

In his will the Black Prince expressed a wish that two armorial shields bearing the insignia of the feathers with the scroll and motto "Ich Dien," I serve, should be disquartelles,"and the other for peace, "et l'autre pour la paix de nos bages des plumes d'ostruce." He further appointed in his will that his Chapel in Canterbury Cathedral should be adorned in various places with his Coat of Arms and likewise with the hadge of Ostrich Feathers. An old English poem written by Aleyn makes reference to the ostrich

feathers in these lines: "There lay the trophie of our chivalry Plumed of his ostridge feathers which the prince

Tooke as the ensign of his victory. Which he did after weare and ever since achievement beare

Which Edward first did win by conquest there."

Randle Holme, another authority, educes the three ostrich feathers from a totally different source. He asserts that they were the insignia of the Prince of Wales during the independence of Wales prior to the invasion of the Edglish.
