Making New Canadians

THIRTY-NINE young Polish-Canadians marched up and down the yard of a country school in Northern Manitoba and took their marching orders from a sergeant-major of fourteen years. They went through the manual exercise as precisely as a regiment of trained soldiers, and when they were through with it they passed in file into the school house.

All through the prairie West the Canadianization of the foreign-speaking people is being given an increased amount of attention, and in many cases with surprisingly good results. What has been done in that one Manitoba school is being done in many others in that province and in Saskatchewan and Alberta.

Dr. J. T. M. Anderson was a short time ago appointed director of education for new Canadians in Saskatchewan, and with the endorsement of the Provincial Department of Education is now initiating a policy that aims at giving to every child of non-English parentage a training necessary for good Canadian citizenship.

It used to be more than a year's salary made up for to live as the teachers in the average foreign-speaking community out West had to live. There was in many cases no room for them to do but to go aboarding with some of the funny-named people whose children they taught by day, and in whose bad-smelling houses they slept at night.

A similar plan is being put into effect in Alberta also. The Department of Education in that province will prepare plans for small residences for teachers, and will pay one-third of the cost of construction if the building is of a value of not less than \$1,000.

Both in Saskatchewan and Alberta the new plans of the Education Department involve a wider use of the school building as a centre of community life and betterment. In the latter province the trustees will be encouraged to furnish the schools so that they can be used as community halls for lectures, concerts, and such like.

Saskatchewan will try the plan of stocking some of its schools in non-English communities with newspapers and magazines. Grapalinos will also be recommended to the trustees as a means of cultivating the children's taste for good music and oratory, and wherever practicable sewing machines will be installed for the girls.

Some of the rural districts of Saskatchewan, where the non-English population is dominant, have never before had winter schools, but the experiment has proved a success, and will likely be continued. In all such cases an effort is being made to cultivate community spirit and to use

the school as a real source of social betterment. Here is a report from a teacher in one such school that shows how the plan is working out: "We opened school about the middle of January. PRINCE OF WALES' FEATHERS. Badge Worn by Heir to the British Throne.

"What is the origin of the Prince of Wales' feathers?" asked young hopeful. "Never heard of them," answered one member of the family. "Something to do with the Battle of Creecy, I think," chimed in father. Of course the most natural thing to do was to look it up and find out what the authorities had to say about the matter. The authorities seem to differ slightly in their theories.

The three ostrich plumes are the badge of the Heir Apparent to the throne of England. The ostrich feathers must not be confused with the Coat of Arms of the Prince of Wales which is an entirely different insignia altogether. The popular belief is that the ostrich feathers were won from Philip of Valois at the Battle of Creecy when the Black Prince so gallantly served his father Edward III and his country by defeating the French.

An authority on heraldry, Charles Boutell, maintains that there is no foundation for the belief that the feathers were won from King Philip of Valois. The theory, he says, is not supported by any contemporary. The first time the feathers are mentioned in any record is in a document which was dated 1299. The Battle of Creecy was fought in A.D. 1346. In 1369 the three feathers were grouped together by Arthur Tudor, Prince of Wales, eldest son of Henry VII, and the ostrich feathers were entered for the first time into a coronet by Prince Edward who afterwards became King Edward VI, but who never really was Prince of Wales.

Edward III used the ostrich feathers as a badge with his shield of arms, and the feathers were also used by Queen Philippa, his wife, as a heraldic device in 1370. The ostrich feathers appear on some, but not on all seals of the Black Prince and were omitted from some



PRINCE OF WALES' CREST. of his seals after the Battle of Creecy.

The feathers were also used by all the other sons of Edward III, but each with some slight difference. In his will the Black Prince expressed a wish that two armorial shields bearing the insignia of the Prince with the scroll and motto "Ich Dien" (I serve), should be displayed in the procession immediately preceding his remains, "L'un pour la guerre et nos armes entrees quartelles," and the other for peace, "et l'autre pour la paix de nos bagues de plumes d'oiseaux." He further appointed in his will that his Chapel in Canterbury Cathedral should be adorned in various places with his Coat of Arms and likewise with the badge of Ostrich Feathers.

An old English poem written by Aberg makes reference to the ostrich feathers in these lines: "There lay the trophie of our chivalry, Plumed of his ostridge feathers, which the prince Tooke as the ensign of his victory, Which he did after wear and ever since."

The Prince of Wales doth that achievement bears, Which Edward first did win by conquest there. Randle Holme, another authority, deduces the three ostrich feathers from a totally different source. He asserts that they were the insignia of the Prince of Wales during the independence of Wales prior to the invasion of the country by the King of England as Princes of Wales continued the badge assigned with a coronet with the motto "Ich Dien" to express the sentiment that although of paramount dignity in that country they still owed allegiance to the crown of England.

Richard II adopted the ostrich feathers and they were placed on either side of his crested helm in the heraldic sculpture of Westminster Hall. They were also placed on his Royal Seal and were habitually used for decoration and heraldic display. Richard II also granted them as a mark of especial favor to be borne as an augmentation of the highest honor to his cousin, Thomas Mowbray, Duke of Norfolk.

Henry Stuart, eldest son of James I established the arrangement of the three ostrich feathers within a scroll's coronet in place of the prince. Ostrich feathers were also worn as a badge by the sons of Henry IV, and by the Beauforts, and were held in high esteem by both the rival houses of York and Lancaster.

It is also recorded that the white ostrich feather with its pen golden wings and its feathers white, silver, or black, is the Duke of Lancaster's, and the feather white having its pen Company is the Duke of Somerset's.
