STORAGE AND PRICES. The monthly report of the Cost of Living Commissioner, including de halls of practically all the cold stormin Canada, contains some

August 1st, says this report, there were in cold storage approximately two and a half pounds of butter, two pounds of cheese, two dozen of eggs. four pounds of pork, two and onehalf pounds of beef, one-sixth pound of poultry and three pounds of fish per head of population in the Dominion. Considering the seasonal character of some of the products, the Monetary Times is disposed to regard the figures as remarkably small. Clearly, they do not represent more than a few weeks' supply at'the outside. 



The Prince Breaks Victory Loan Standard to Breeze Ottawa Ottawa, Sept. 2 .- Two significant facts were emphasized yesterday morning when the Prince of Wales unfurled the first Victory Loan Honor Flag in front of the Parliament Buildings at the conclusion of the ceremony in connection with the laying of the corner-stone of the new tower of the Parliament buildings. The first was that the Honor flags to be awarded this year to those cities and districts which exceeded their objectives in the Victory Loan campaign are to be known as the Prince of Wales' Flags, and the second that the ceremony took place on the morning of Labor Day as a fitting tribute to organized labor in Canada, and as recognition of the part that Labor played in the great war, not only the fighting men at the front, but the great army of munition and
