**MATRICULATION RESULTS**

FOR KINGSTON AND DISTRICT ARE JUST ANNOUNCED.

The Names of Those Who Passed—Explanations Given With Regard to the Various Groups.

The following list contains the names of the candidates who were successful in whole or in part on the Pass Junior Matriculation Examination. Middle School Normal Entrance candidates who were not candidates for matriculation have been considered in the results.

In Group 1, are given names of candidates who have obtained complete matriculation by passing on the twelve required examination papers—English literature, English composition, British and Canadian history, ancient history, algebra, geometry, Latin authors, Latin compositions, together with four special papers.

In Group 2, appear the names of candidates who passed at least nine of the papers required for complete matriculation, and obtained the minimum required on whole examination and have not failed on more than three papers. To complete matriculation they must pass on all papers indicated at one examination, the standard for passing being 40 per cent.

In Group 3, names are given of candidates who failed to obtain minimum required on whole examination, but who secured 40 per cent. on each of at least eight papers with average of 60 per cent. on same. These candidates have been granted partial matriculation and to complete matriculation must obtain at one examination 40 per cent. on each of the remaining papers an average of 60 per cent. on same.

Candidates writing on fewer than eight papers are not reported here. Candidates must wait for receipt of their statements of marks in order to ascertain the results. Certificates and statements of marks obtained by unsuccessful candidates are in course of preparation and are being mailed to principals. Candidates who failed on July matriculation in whole or in part are eligible to become candidates at the supplemental matriculation examination beginning Friday, Sept. 12th.


