

J. R. CARTWRIGHT DEAD.

He Had Been In Failing Health for John R. Cartwright, Deputs Attorney-General for Ontario, died on Wednesday. Mr. Cartwright had been failing in health for some time. Third sen of the late John S. Cartwright, Q.C., M.P., he was born at Kingston on February 28th, 1842.

He was educated at Rugby and Oxford, winning his B.A. in 1866. He was called to the bar in 1871, and in 1878 was appointed clerk of process at Osgoode Hall. In 1889 he was appointed Deputy Attorney-General. The Province of Ontario has lost a most valued public servant, and the Covernment a most conscientious and single-minded counsellor.

A Contractor Dead. Word was received on Wednesday announcing the death of Robert Weddell, the prominent harbor contractor, at his home in Trenton. He has been ill for some time. Mr. Weddell was about seventy years of age and had been for many years engaged in dredging and similar contracts for governments and municipalities. He was a shrewd financier and was considered one of the ablest business men in the Bay of Quinte district. He was married three times, all three of his wives having preceded him to the tomb. He is survived by one son, Robert, Jr., and one daughter, Mrs. Charles Weaver, both of Trenton,
