## Rugby Briefs.

"Buster" Reid, former McGill scrumman, is coaching the London team in the Ontario Rugby Football Union.

Jack O'Connor may, after all, be lost to the Argonauts. He contemplates a trip to Missouri for a special college course. Laddie Cassels and Dick Sheehy may both be out with the Argonauts this week.

While the Canadian Rugby title has not been played for since 1915, under the schedule provided by that body the games this year will take place on the grounds of the Ontario and Inter-Provincial winners.

The Hamilton Tigers and the Toronto Rugby and Athletic Club will meet in an exhibition game next Saturday, September 27th. They may also have a return game at some later date.

Gordon Willis says the Ottawas must introduce more pep to their line.

He would like to see Andy Davies and Martin Kilt out with the red, white and black squad.

Bobby Kerr says Tigers will have one of the fastest and strongest teams that has ever worn the yellow and black. This is going some. They've had some corkers.

McGill men are wearing special steel lined shoes, which prevents them from turning their ankles. This was an invention of Coach Frank Shaughnessy. McGill will not have Cyril Flanagan, as he is suffering from an injury he sustained in France.

Here's good news for frail young half backs of the Interprovincial team. Percy Roberts is out with the M.A.A.A. team, and will probably play in their scrimmage. He is said to be showing all his old-time "pep".

Alex Sinclair, veteran wing man of the Argonauts, is said to be going great guns again. He is usually the first man out on the field and the last one to leave. He will play inside for the Double Blue. Doug Garrett continues to do the work behind the line for Argonauts.

Bert Harper is likely to coach the Hamilton Rowing Club senior team. Frank Hefferman, former Ottawa College center half, has turned out with the T. R. and A. A. team. He will play in the backfield for "Liz" Marriott's team. Vivian, the English soccer player, who was protested a few years ago for playing under an assumed name, is also out with the Ontario Union competitors.

It is said that Dick Sheehy may join the Argonaut squad this week.

Judging from the players already at work, the team will be the lightest that has represented McGill in many seasons. What is lacking in weight will be offset by the speed which is a useful factor in rugby.

Ken Cassels practiced with Toronto R. and A.A. on Saturday, but announced that he was going back to Ottawa.

Victoria College grounds, Toronto, may be used by both Argos and Capitals for practice.

If the Interprovincial Inter-mediate series does not materialize Argos will play in the O.R.F.U.

## THE QUEBEC UNION BETTER FOR KINGSTON THAN THE ONTARIO

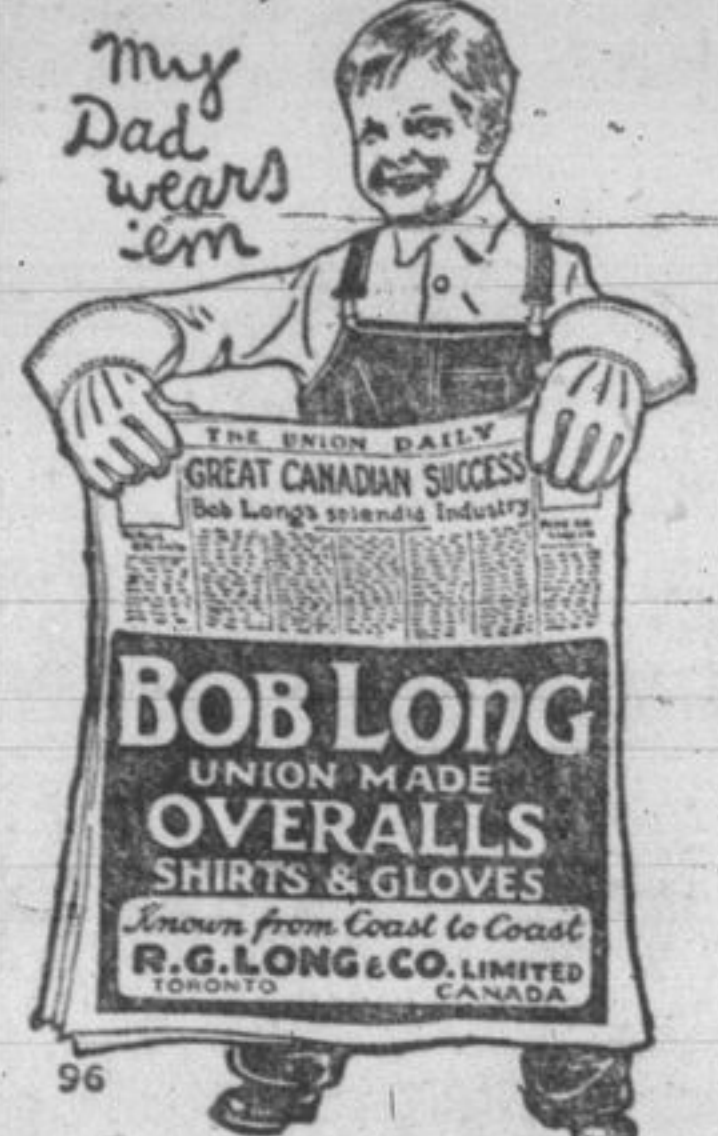

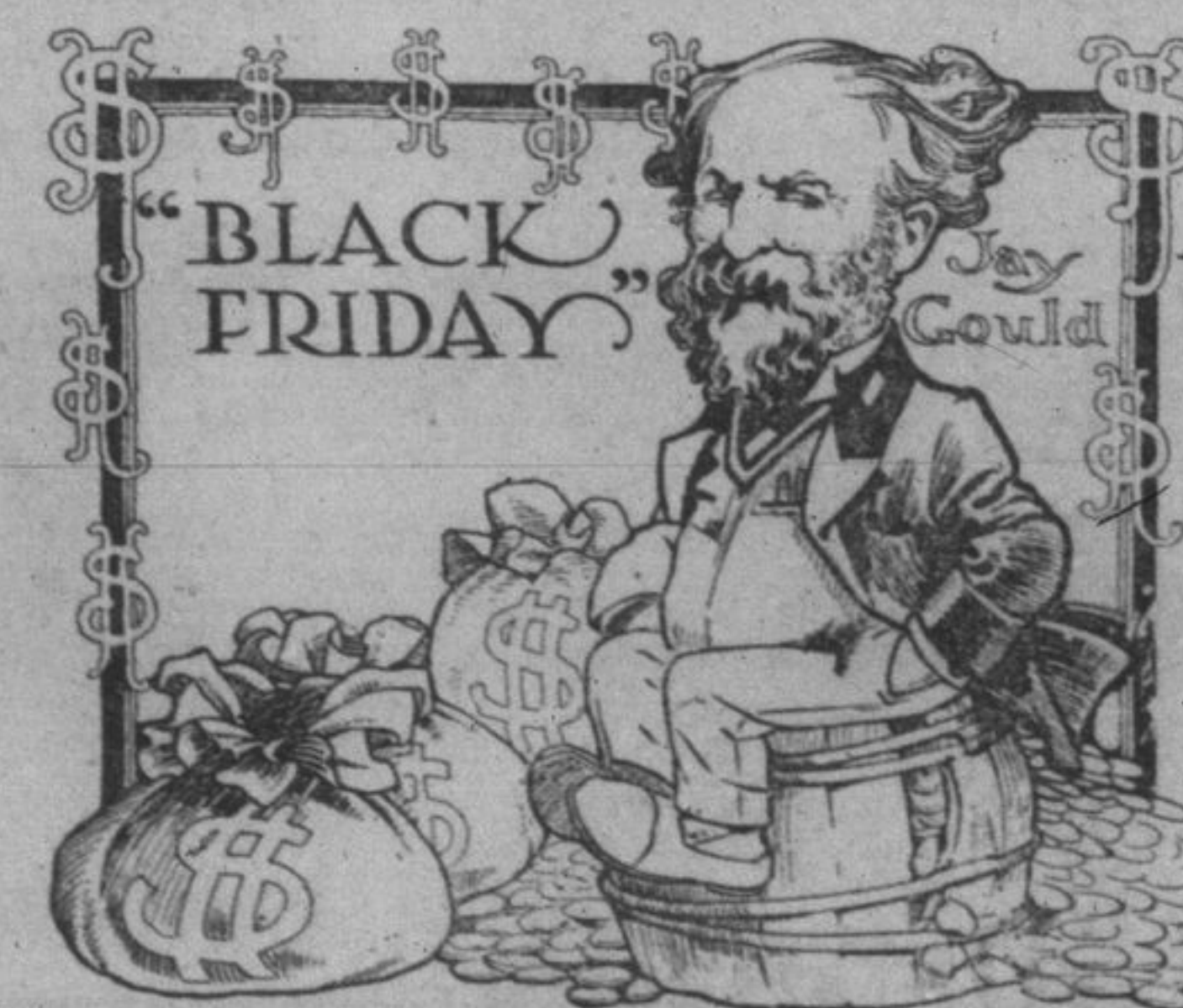
