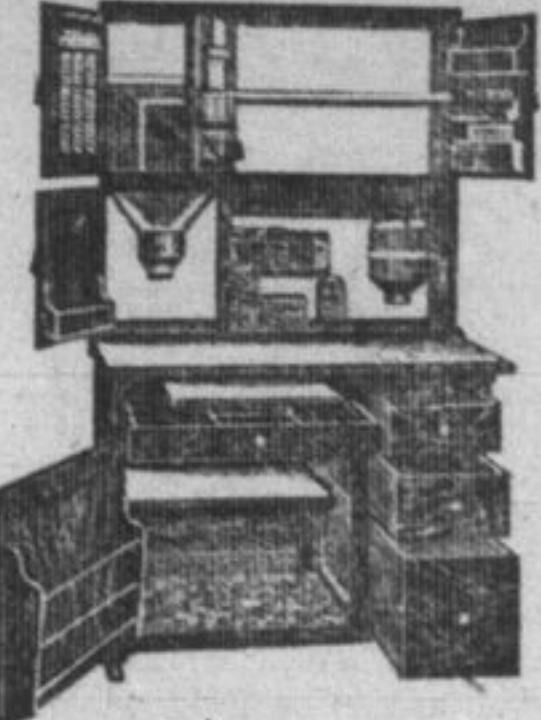

## WIND HAMPERS THE WORK JURY ATTACHES NO BLAME

DONNELLY WRECKING COMPANY AT THE BARGE HILDA.

Already 5,000 Bushels of Grain Have Been Removed—Must Abandon Work For Time.

A despatch from Sackett's Harbor says: Donnelly wrecking outfit, comprising the tug Cornwall together with the clam shell lighter Harriet D. and the barge Cobourg, under the command of Capt. John Donnelly, returned to this port about three o'clock this morning after having successfully taken 5,000 bushels of dry grain from the wrecked barge Hilda at Stoney Point.

After the Hilda was located at Stoney Point, the Donnelly wrecking outfit was engaged to salvage as much as possible from the wreck. They arrived upon the scene of the wreck Saturday, but as the fog of the Hilda is such that she is exposed to the whole sweep of the lake, with the wind from a southerly or south-westerly quarter. As the wind was fresh from the south Capt. Donnelly came down into Sackett's Harbor to be as near as possible, and watch for a chance that weather conditions would allow him to work. The wind having let up Sunday afternoon, Capt. Donnelly left here about four o'clock and went to the wreck and worked at her until about midnight, when he was forced by the strong south winds to return to Sackett's Harbor and wait for a favorable change in the weather before resuming operations. The value of the grain salvaged is about \$12,000. Capt. Donnelly reports that the Hilda is ashore about a half of a mile to the south of the Stoney Point lighthouse, and is about one-quarter of a mile from shore, lying head on in nine and a half feet of water forward and ten feet and three inches aft. He also states that after he removed the cargo that there is no doubt but what he can get her off. The Hilda had on board 35,000 bushels of wheat valued at \$80,000. The boat itself is valued at \$40,000. The Donnelly wrecking outfit is the largest outfit on Lake Ontario. The tug Cornwall is a powerful side wheel tug, having a draft of only six and a half feet, which allows her to work in very shallow water. She has a salvage capacity of 250 tons.

The clam shell lighter Harriet D. is fitted out with a thirty-ton derrick together with a clam shell which will take thirty-five bushels of grain at once, from any batch of the wreck and dump it into any hatch of the lighter. This outfit carried four twelve-inch rotary steam pumps, one five-inch and one four-inch gasoline pump, two six-inch and two four-inch siphons, and three eleven-inch hawsers, together with a complete diving outfit and air compressor. They have accommodations for a wrecking crew of forty men. The salvage capacity of this fleet is about 90,000 bushels of grain and may be so arranged that the dry grain can be kept separate from the wet.

### The Mowat Hospital Exhibit.

The people of the city and surrounding country were given an excellent opportunity at the Kingston Exhibition to see for themselves what is being accomplished at the Mowat Hospital. Not only was the display well worth seeing, but the patients of the hospital were to be seen in the booth doing the work. For the past few months the men have taken a great deal of interest in the work and often hinted that the Mowat was going to have a name in the country for the manufacture of all classes of ready work, weaving, bead work, fancy work, embroidery, wood carving, and so on. Through the kindness of the directors of the exhibition, and more especially of the general manager, R. Bushell, the boys were afforded an excellent opportunity to display their work and have special prizes donated for the same; and this at no cost to themselves. Not only this, but passes were donated to them as exhibitors. The boys wish to take this opportunity to thank the management of the exhibition as well as the people of the city and district who were so good as to patronize them.

### Whist Drive and Dances.

A pleasant event was held in the G.W.V.A. rooms Tuesday evening when the George Richardson Chapter of the Daughters of the Empire staged a whist drive and dances. Over eighty people were present and the drive was voted by all to be a great success. Many tables were set and were played and the prizes were won as follows: Ladies, first, Mrs. W. Hall; second, Miss Elliot, and consolation to Mrs. Brown. Gentlemen, first, Mr. Hussey, second Mr. Edwards, and consolation to Mr. Rae. Miss Jennie Wilson played some choice musical selections during the drive. Refreshments were served by the ladies of the Chapter and then a dances was held until 11 o'clock. J. J. Eva was the master of ceremonies for the evening and a very hearty vote of thanks was tendered to him.
