The following is a copy of the notice sent to sixteen butchers in the Kingston district: "Under instructions from Dr. Maloney, district officer of health, the local Board of Health of the Township of Kingston hereby notify you that you must immediately comply with and observe Board of Health respecting slaughter houses where not under licensed inspector, a copy of which is herewith given you. In default you will be liable to repeated fines of \$500.


