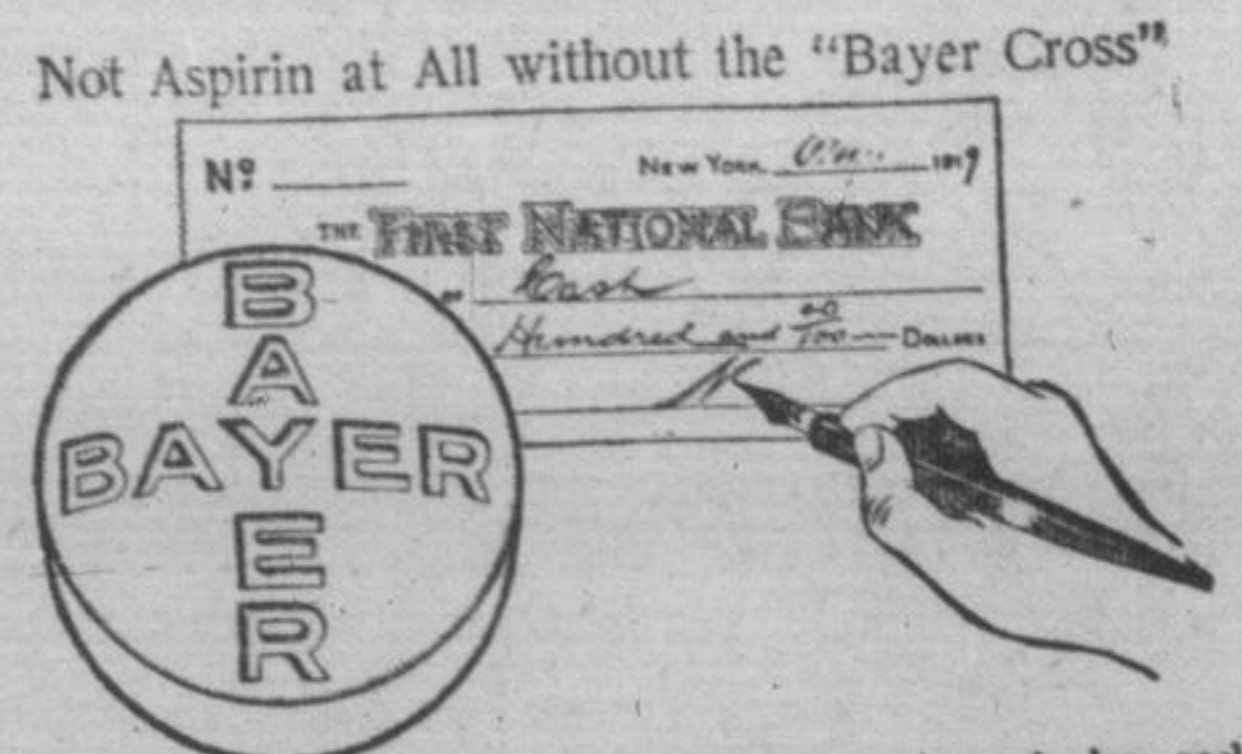

STANDING FOR PROHIBITION

WHAT HOTEL MEN IN PERTH HAVE TO SAY.

Nonsense to Say a Hotel Cannot Be Run Without the Sale of Liquor—The Bar Is Finished For Good.

Perth, Oct. 7.—Prohibition for the past two years has altered public opinion considerably.

"It is nonsense to say that a man can't run a hotel without a license to sell liquor," stated W. J. Glascock, a hotel-keeper.

P. J. Kehoe, of the Revere hotel, had about the same opinion to give. He also gave the information that he was showing a bigger profit and receipts for June of this year than the hotel showed for the same month when the town was "wet."

THE ROYAL MARRIAGE ACT.

Prince of Wales Almost Sure to Marry a Commoner.

Who is the Prince of Wales going to marry? It is a pretty safe bet that the lady of his choice will not be a princess—not until he marries her—and that she will not have a drop of royal blood in her veins.

The Prince of Wales may, however, have a surprise in store, and next the heart of a plain, untitled "miss." Gossip is rife as to whom he will wed, and more than one American girl is doubtless wondering how it would feel to wear a crown and have the duchesses bobbing and curtsying to her.

The Royal Marriage Act was passed in 1772 prohibiting any descendant of George II., except those who possess married into foreign houses, from contracting marriages before the age of 25 without the assent of the King signified under the Great Seal.

After the age of 25 the act decrees that they may marry without royal assent, but only by giving notice of their intention to the Privy Council 12 months before the ceremony, and subject to the approval of both Houses of Parliament.

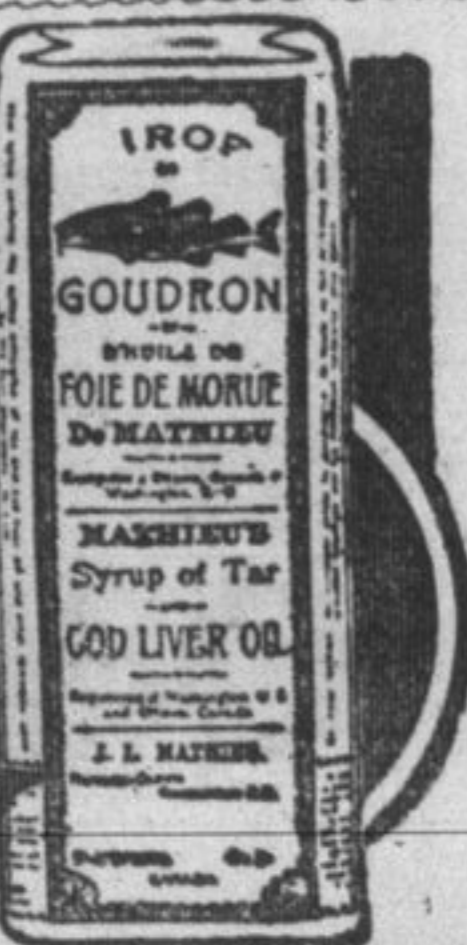

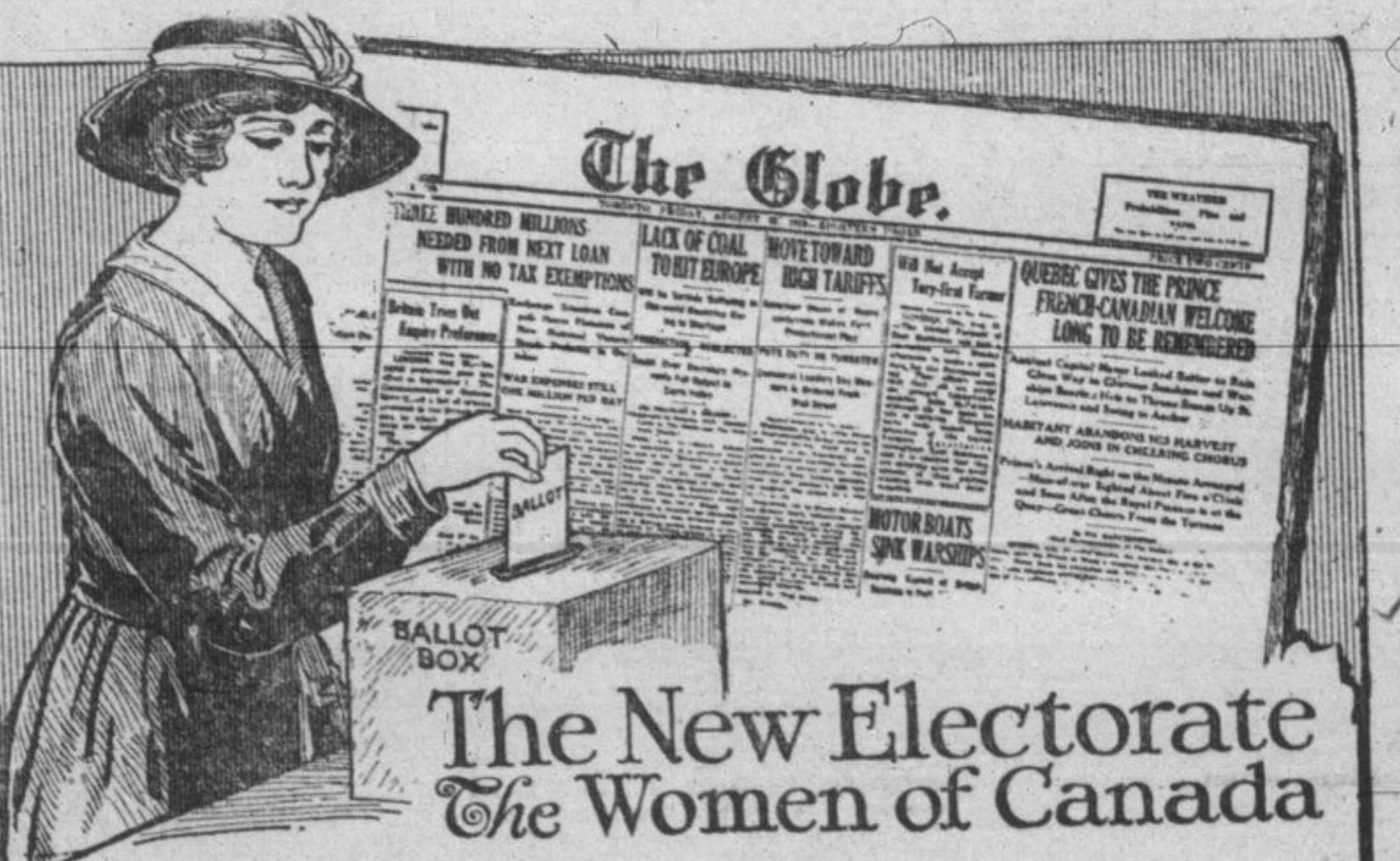
