REFUSE RE-INSTATEMENT

Of The Brockville-Belleville G. T. R. Trains.

The secretary of the Board of Trade is in receipt of the judgment of the Dominion Railway Board upon the application submitted by Kingston and Brockville for the reinstatement of local train Nos. 31 and 32 that have been removed by the management of the Grand Trunk Railway. These trains ran between Brockville and Belleville daily, and the railway claimed that they lost money by their operation. The judgment is as follows:

"In view of the disparity between the earnings and the out-of-pocket costs, and, having in mind the existing train service, an order for the reinstatement of trains Nos. 31 and 32 would not be justified on the facts before us."
