



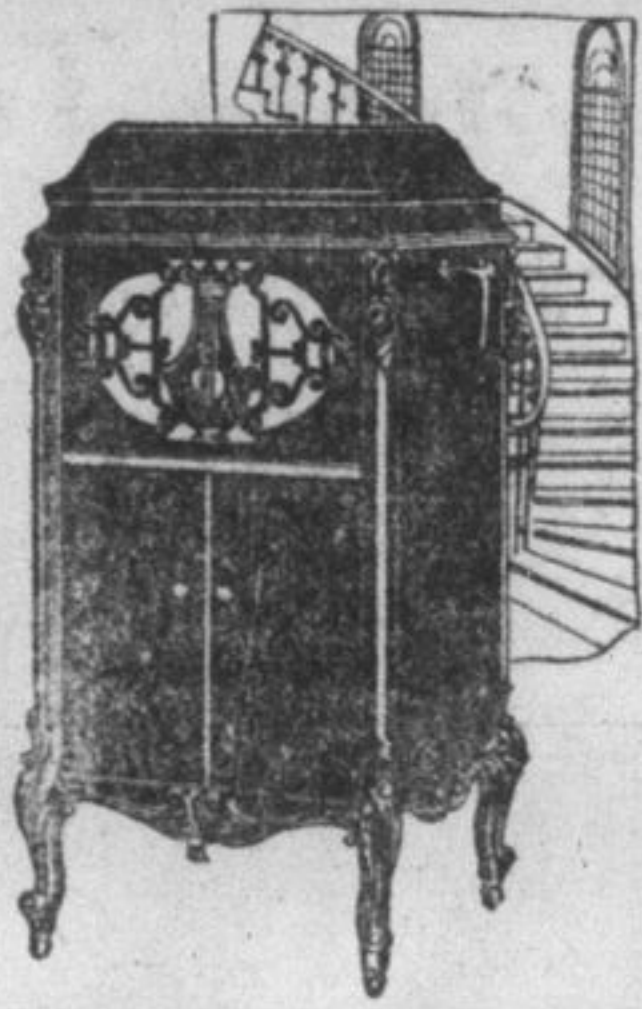

## KINGSTON VOTE NOT LARGE HAS MADE GOOD PROGRESS

OWING TO THE MEMBER BEING ELECTED BY ACCLAMATION.

The Prohibition Workers Have the Polls Strongly Manned and Expect a Good Majority.

Up until noon the vote on the referendum had been very light in Kingston. The workers expected that the afternoon would bring out a great number of the voters, as most of the women were too busy in the morning attending to home affairs to get out and vote.

A Whig man who visited every polling sub-division, and there are fifty-nine of them, was surprised to find that the men of the Citizens' Liberty League were not manning the polls. The prohibition people were right on the job with lots of workers and many cars.

Prominent prohibition workers stated that they did not expect there would be a heavy vote, but nevertheless when the count was taken they expected that the vote would be strongly in their favor. The fact that there is an acclamation here means that the usual election vote will not be got to the polls.

#### Sir Henry's Birth Certificate

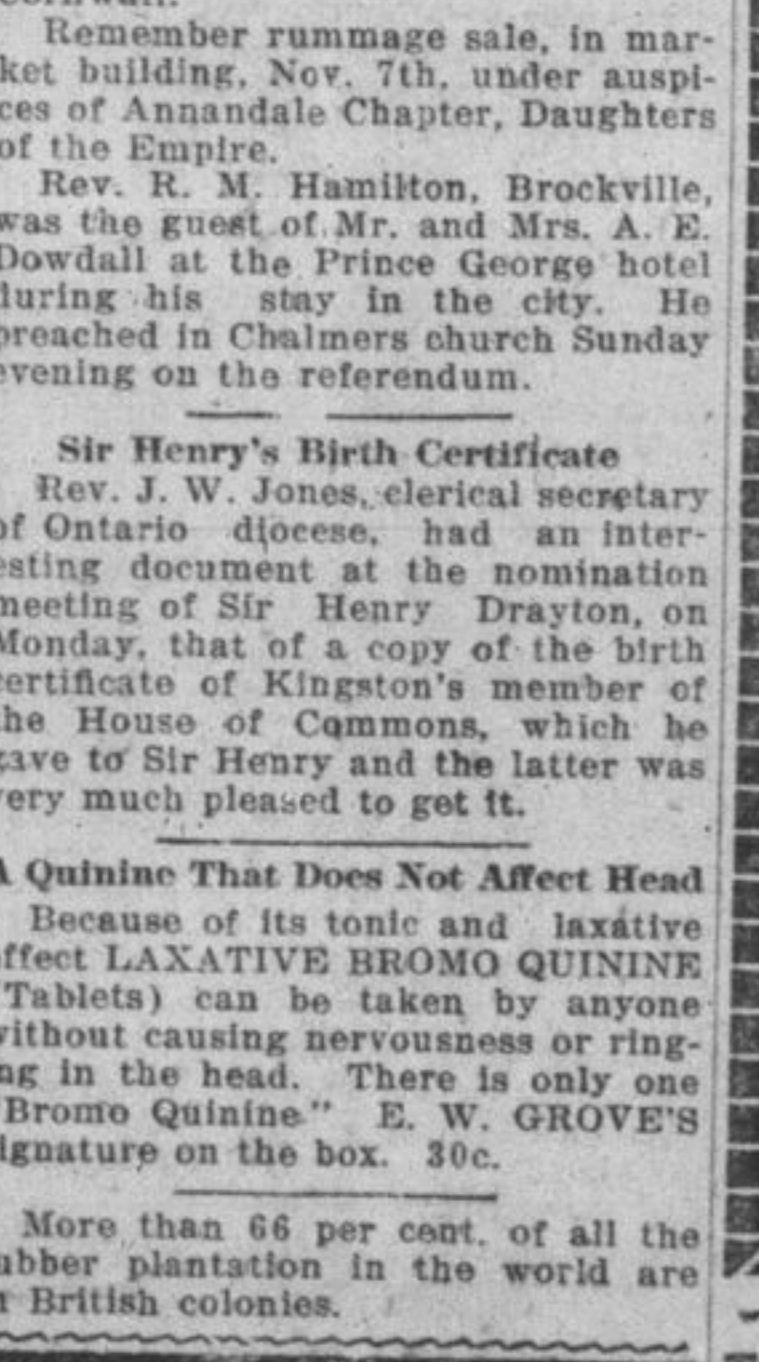

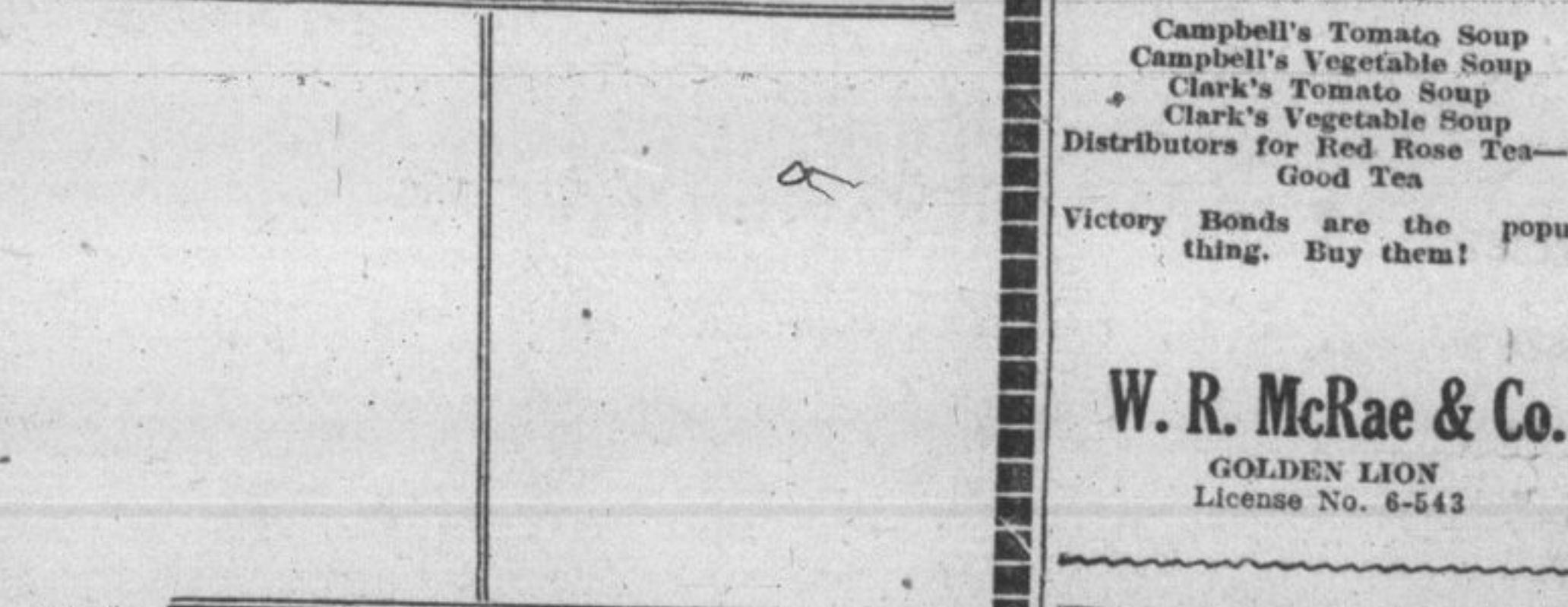

#### TO PRESS THE G.T.R. DEAL TO A FINISH

#### Sir George E. Foster Made This Announcement to Montreal Deputation.

Ottawa, Oct. 20.—Sir George E. Foster, representing the Dominion Government, today stated that legislation for the government acquisition of the Grand Trunk would be pressed to a conclusion. This was in reply to a Montreal deputation which interviewed the members of Cabinet and expressed strong opposition to the proposal.

There is no prospect that parliament can conclude its sessions this week. The debate on the Grand Trunk deal is likely to take up several days and the senate has to tackle it yet.

#### CERTAIN MEN HOSTILE TO THE GOVERNMENT

Is the Claim Made By United States Senator Watson of Indiana.

Washington, Oct. 20.—Sensational charges that Socialists, Reds and other radicals are "intrenched in government departments, and particularly that the investigating force of the federal trade commission contain men hostile to the Government and American institutions, were made in the Senate today by Senator Watson, republican, Indiana, who introduced a resolution for an investigation by the Inter-State commerce committee.
