

**GAVE LEAGUE A KNOCKOUT**

REV. W. T. G. BROWN ATTACKS CITIZENS LIBERTY LEAGUE

A Big Prohibition Rally Was Held in Strand Theatre on Sunday Night.

The largest attended prohibition rally yet held in Kingston, took place in the Strand Theatre on Sunday night. The hall was packed to the doors and hundreds were turned away. The speaker was the Rev. W. T. G. Brown of Sydenham Street Methodist Church, who gave a magnificent discourse on "Personal Liberty."

In a masterful way Mr. Brown criticized the Liberty League and all its works. He tore their so-called sworn statements limb from limb, until it must have been hard for the audience to find out what the Liberty League did stand on. In quoting Prof. John Watson of Queen's, Mr. Brown said that Dr. Watson was a prophet, for he read from his book the following words: "Liberty is good or bad, according to the things done being good or bad." How then could the Liberty League claim liberty. The league asks for liberty to do evil, for liberty to make drunkards of men, poverty-stricken wretches of wives and children, and this was called "liberty." Women who neglect to go and vote for any reason are doing the cause of temperance a serious harm.

Mr. Brown concluded by giving all present some advice as to how to vote, where to vote, when and what to vote. He said he wished to thank the papers for the support that they had given the cause.

Mrs. Bertha Bolling, sister of Mrs. Woodrow Wilson, wears a simple frock of dark navy blue cotton voile marked in the tiniest of dots set very thickly together. A one-piece effect, the frock has a surplice bodice with a tiny inset-vest of organdie and cuffs and collar also of organdie. The skirt has rather long swinging hip draperies.

A very smart frock of plain white georgette combined with small polka-dot pattern in coral pink formed an attractive frock the other evening at an informal dinner at one of the suburban "inns" which have sprung up like mushrooms during the past two seasons.

**LAUDS NELSON DAY.**

Sir Bertram Hayes Approves Objects to Campaign.

Sir Bertram Hayes, K.B.E., D.S.O., R.N.R., captain of the Olympic, was much interested in his recent visit to Toronto, when informed of the Nelson Day campaign to raise \$500,000. The distinguished visitor expressed his warm approval of the objects of the drive, and sent the following letter to Commodore Aemilius Jarvis, President of the Navy League of Canada:

"I heard to-day while speaking at the Canadian Club of the appeal that the Navy League in Canada is again making in the interests of sailors, and I take this occasion to say how grateful we are at what Canada has done in the past in this direction, and I am sincerely hoping that this year your appeal will not be upon deaf ears.

Now that the war is over, we are realizing to the full measure the destruction submarine warfare has wrought in the lives of our merchant seamen and the number of dependents that have been left behind. Whilst the seamen are receiving a greater wage than they ever did before, still this has not been for a sufficient time to allow him to accumulate anything and the dependents of those who have gone have not participated.

If Canada is to wake to her own interests, she will back the Navy League's efforts to realize what sea power means to a country. It means prosperity, it means defence, and we want more seamen so that British ships will be all manned by British subjects."

**MUST HARMONIZE WITH HAT**

Hats are by no means to be regarded as nonessential part of the costume.

Hatpins are little things and almost nonessential except on windy days, but put the wrong hatpin—even the slightest, plainest one—into a hat and the whole effect is spoiled, and the hatpin is proved, after all, to be of great importance. So if one must wear hatpins they should be chosen with the greatest care.

Small, inconspicuous gold hatpins are attractive in a plain sailor hat of light color, and gunmetal ones are suitable for hats of darker hue. But for summer hats in all their glory of many colors new and original hatpins have been devised. These are of enamel and represent flowers or butterflies or fruits; some of them are small and some are quite large, but their chief charm lies in the fact that one can find hatpins to harmonize with almost any hat trimming and thus avoid a jarring note. What could be more charming than a little coral rose nestling in the midst of the flowers on a hat? Or a cloisonne leaf among leaves?—New York Evening Sun.
