FEAR THE MURDER OF IRON KING'S SON
W. E. Lempke Found Dead on Yacht with Hands Tied.

New York, Oct. 21.—Police today were investigating the death of John W. Lempke, 21, son of William E. Lempke, iron manufacturer. The young man's body, dressed in woman's clothing, was found with hands tied tightly and an oil-cloth over the head, on the deck of the Lempke motor-boat late yesterday. Police on first inspection declared Lempke had committed suicide, while members of the family insisted he has been murdered, asserting his position proved he could not have killed himself. Lempke's clothing lay on a chair near the body.

KINGDOM FOR CONNAUGHT.
 Hungarians Would Not Oppose His Election.
 Paris, Oct. 21.—The inter-Allied commission at Budapest, according to the Intransigent, recently received delegates of the monarchial party, who demanded the right to elect a Hungarian sovereign. They declared that they were not advocating the return of one of the Hapsburg house and would not oppose the selection of an English Prince, particularly the Duke of Connaught. The Intransigent adds that the Duke of Connaught's candidacy has not been confirmed in official circles.

GERMANY UNDER-BIDDING.
 Putting Machinery on Market at Half American Price.
 New York, Oct. 21.—German manufacturers of machinery are under-bidding American firms in France to a very large extent in offerings for business, according to A. L. Findley, editor of the Iron Age, who was among the passengers on the Adriatic, arriving here today. Mr. Findley said he had been abroad making an investigation of business conditions and the prospects of rebuilding war-damaged industries. Germany is already in the market, and offerings as low as one-half of that made by Americans have been made by machinery manufacturers, he added. In reconstruction progress Belgium is far ahead of France, he said.
