A FINE SOUVENIR

Prepared by the Grand Trunk for The Prince.

The Grand Trunk Railway System has supplied for the use of the Prince of Wales and his staff on their tour through Eastern Canada, over the lines of the railway, a specially designed descriptive itinerary. This book is bound in real leather, is magnificently illustrated, and a notable production in every way. On the olive green leather of the cover is distinguished in gold, the arms of His Royal Highness, with crest, badges and supporters, while in the corners are the emblems of England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales and Canada. The frontispiece is a copper etching of Niagara Falls, signed by the artist. The other illustrations are printed in sepia on heavy suede finished coated stock and show the features of the territory which His Royal Highness will visit during his tour of Ontario and Quebec, also the striking developments in motive power and bridge building. The letterpress is printed on the finest of hand made loft dried stock and is descriptive of the points of interest between North Bay and Hamilton, Niagara Falls and Brantford, Quebec, Stratford and Woodstock, Chatham, London and Windsor, and Toronto, Kingston, Brockville and Montreal. Maps of the Grand Trunk System are mounted in silk in specially provided pockets. The "edition de luxe" is limited to one hundred copies, all numbered, and these are enclosed in handsome boxes with the arms of His Royal Highness stamped on them. In the foreword to this beautiful book reference is made to the important part played by the Grand Trunk in the development of Canada.

"The building of the railway, linking up the widely separated centres of population and activity, has been described," says this foreword, "as the most important forward step in the period immediately preceding Confederation. Without the means of communication provided by the creation of railway lines, the union of British North America would have been a union in name only. It was one of the Fathers of Confederation, Sir George Etienne Cartier, K.C.M.G., who presented to the Canadian Legislature the Act to incorporate the Grand Trunk Railway Company and that distinguished statesman regarded with pride the prominent part he had taken in the establishment of the railway. "I had charge of the Act which created the Grand Trunk."
