**DEMAND FOR MORE HOTELS**

**TO MEET REQUIREMENTS AT THE THOUSAND ISLANDS.**

Waterloo, Oct. 28.—Promoters of the Thousand Islands are resolved that there shall be no lack of accommodations for the public another season. The big crowds that flocked to the St. Lawrence river this year from the middle of June to late September have occasioned a boom such as the resort has not known in years. Hotels were crowded and cottages at a premium during the vacation months and proprietors of hosteleries are planning additions and promoters of new hotels are busy with negotiations for new sites.  
Already additional facilities for the public are assured. Since the acquisition of the Thousand Island House at Alexandria Bay from the Col. O. G. Staples estate by W. H. Warburton, the manager, plans have been perfected for a 106-room addition. Mr. Warburton has incorporated the Thousand Island House Company, capitalized at \$50,000 and backed by wealthy New Yorkers. The addition is to be located up the river from the present wooden structure. A large garage is to be maintained in connection.  
The recent purchase of Murray Hill Hotel property by a wealthy New Yorker leaves little doubt that this resort will be available for the tourist next summer after being closed for many years. Further up the river, at Cape Vincent, the Hotel Carleton will be provided with an annex to meet increasing demands.  
It is known that agents of the Dupont-Nemours Company of New York, owners of the Waldorf Astoria and the Bellevue Stratford, have been negotiating for Round Island property, including the site of the burned Frontenac. Some adjacent cottages and a farm property on the mainland opposite the island have been purchased, it is said. It is assumed that these negotiations are being conducted with the view of erecting a hotel in connection with the company's other properties.  
Rumor also has it that a deal has been practically closed whereby Hart Island, the beautiful resort under- taken by the late George C. Boldt, is to become the property of a new hotel corporation. This island, with its crumbling magnificence, lies across the American channel from Alexandria Bay and is in the heart of the river homes. The mammoth, unfinished home, with something like ninety rooms, could be easily adapted to hotel purposes.  
Even should the boom predicted for the islands in the future result in no greater popularity than that of a few years ago, more accommodation would be needed. The destruction by fire of the Frontenac on Round Island, the Columbian at Thousand Island Park, the Locust at St. Lawrence park and the Fine River house on Wellesley Island, reduced the housing facilities to far below normal.

**MAY RAISE THE KEYSTONE**

**TOLEDO WRECKING COMPANY GO AFTER SUNKEN STEAMER.**  
A Number of Barges and Steamers At the Bottom of Lake Ontario.  
Oswego, Oct. 28.—Capt. Clarence LaBeau, of the LaBeau Wrecking Co., of Toledo, may go after the big steamer Keystone which is at the bottom of the St. Lawrence river, if suitable arrangements can be made with the underwriters, he said to-day.  
There is a lot of work on Lake Ontario. There are a number of barges and steamers at the bottom of the lake that could be easily brought up from 75 to 100 feet of water with modern diving apparatus, if once located on the bottom. The steel steamer Roberval which founded three or four years ago with a cargo of lumber, is some where between this port and Stoney Island. The steamer Waffle which also went down this fall is supposed to be somewhere on this shore and there is the barge city working time. Drumheller needs one hundred cars a day, Wayne thirty-seven and Rosedale twenty-six. Protests are being made to the headquarters of the Canadian National Railways by the Drumheller authorities, mine operators, Calgary City Council and the Calgary Board of Trade. **To Increase Church Membership.**

The Methodists of the city are planning to add a large number of members to the church during the coming few months. On Wednesday a mass meeting of the members of the four Methodist churches is being held at which definite plans will be decided upon. The boards of the four churches at a meeting held recently passed a resolution adopting the idea of the Forward Movement.

**Belleville Memorial.**

A memorial shield contributed by the pupils of St. Andrew's church, Belleville, was on Sunday afternoon unveiled with appropriate ceremony. Upon the shield were twelve copper maple leaves bearing the names of the twelve brave young men of the church who made the supreme sacrifice during the war. The pupils of the school took part in the ceremony. Rev. Dr. Wilson, pastor of Chalmers Presbyterian church, Kingston, made an appropriate address, referring eulogistically to the sacrifices made by the Canadians.

**Question Was Deferred.**

At the meeting of the City Council Monday night Ald. Jones introduced his by-law calling on the Ontario legislature to amend the section 35, of the Public Utilities Act whereby power in the outlying districts of the city can be supplied with water and gas. He contends that in some cases, the act as it stands, is an extreme hardship. In view of the proposal to have the electors vote on whether or not the gas and water departments shall be taken from the commission and controlled by the city council, Ald. Jones, on the advice of other members of council, decided to allow the matter to stand over.
