A company has been formed at Nottingham, England, to utilize the waste from coal mines in power production, briquet and concrete making and the distillation of by-products.

It has been discovered that a thin coating of lead, applied by the metal spraying process, will protect water turbine blades from being worn by sand carried in water.

A full-sized bathtub, with a water heating attachment using gas or oil, has been invented that can be lifted on one end and rolled on casters to any room where it is desired.

Japan hatches about 80,000,000 salmon eggs annually at its sixty fish hatcheries.

Suitably shaped rolls form the heads on rivets in a new machine for riveting trunks.

Coal deposits that have been discovered in Iceland are estimated to contain 150,000,000 tons.

New in the musical instrument line is a whistle with two tubes that is played like a slide trombone.

An Englishman has invented a machine to enable a singer to hear his own voice as an audience hears it.

An inventor has patented an electric surgical needle that can be adjusted at any length from its handle.

Explosions of a mixture of hydrogen and oxygen are used to drive a French inventor's motor for small boats.

A Swedish law requires that wood alcohol be colored so that it can be distinguished from grain alcohol instantly.

A new transformer for ringing electric bells can be screwed into a light socket, carrying a lamp on its outer end.

For teaching rifle shooting a cross bow equipped with a rifle stock, trigger and sights has been invented in Japan.

To enable a hammer to be used as a hatchet an inventor has patented a blade to be attached to its head with plates.

A South African mine develops 100 horsepower from the fall of water piped into the workings for various other uses.

An inventor has patented a holder

for safety razor blades to make them useful for other than their intended purposes.

All of Switzerland's glaciers are perceptibly receding, a notable one having shrunk more than 1,000 feet in a decade.

Several films can be developed at the same time in recently invented tanks, designed chiefly for amateur photographers.

Columbia produces an average of 39,000 troy ounces of platinum annually, practically all of it from one district.

An aquarium that forms the base of an electric table lamp has been patented in the United States by a Japanese inventor.

In a new shipyard at Belfast all vessels will be built on the electric welding principle instead of by riveting and caulking.

To print advertisements on roads an inventor has patented a rubber stamp to surround an automobile tire and take paint from a tank.

Several new deposits of coal, from which it is estimated that 40,000,000 tons can be extracted, have been discovered in Northern Chile.

A recently-invented cross-cut saw for large log timber is operated by a gasoline motor, mounted on a frame, one end of which is rested on a log.

An English inventor's telephone for use in mining or where explosive gases or liquids are present, is claimed to be explosion and flame proof.

For finishing a concrete roadway a steel rolled with a concave face and weighing a ton, which can be

handled by two or three men has been invented.

An arc light carbon of French invention consists of a solid rod within a hollow cylinder, the arc formed at the end being rotated by a magnetic coil.

A mold has been invented for form concrete posts in holes in the ground, mechanism operated by the crank mixing the concrete as the mold is filled.

A Frenchman is the inventor of a rubber stopper with flexible projection to be folded down around the neck of a bottle to afford additional security.

To supplant hatpins an inventor has patented a metal plate to be fastened inside a woman's hat, inserted to which is a comb to be inserted into the hair.

For beating and renovating furs an electric motor has been invented in Europe that carries a number of flexible rods mounted at right angles to its shaft.

An electric resistance coil warms the air in the intake manifold or carburetor of an automobile engine and enables it to be started quickly in cold weather.

Bohemian chemists have perfected a new coating for safety match boxes that is lighter in weight, fifty per cent. cheaper and more effective than any heretofore used.

An inventor is working on a rigid aluminum dirigible balloon to be steam driven and depending for buoyancy on the lifting power of air heated by kerosene burners.

Both the usual type of cleared wheels and wheels with solid rubber tires are provided for a new farm tractor so that it can be changed into a road vehicle in a few minutes.

Survives of some portions of South America preserve potatoes for months and sometimes for years by alternately freezing and thawing them until all their moisture is removed.

For signaling either between aeroplanes or submarines an eminent inventor has patented a device that slightly alters the speed of their propellers and changes their sound.

It has been discovered by a French scientist that the colored spots which appear on the leaves of books are caused by microscopic fungi, which he has been able to transplant.

Officials in the Philippines are investigating the possibility of obtaining large quantities of a high-grade lubricating oil from a vine that grows wild throughout the islands.

So that meals served in hotel and room can be kept warm an inventor has designed a wheeled table, under the top of which are asbestos insulated compartments to carry the food.

According to a German engineer defects in aluminum welds can be detected by immersing the joints in water, bubbles of hydrogen appearing after forty-eight hours if the welds be defective.

Four sheet iron drums that are covered with iron ribs and revolve sidewise to prevent skidding do the propelling for a Michigan inventor's motor tractor for use on ice and snow.

To prevent spontaneous combustion in large coal piles British scientists have found that iron or earthenware pipes should be inserted to afford ventilation as the coal is piled.

It is estimated that the Victoria Falls of the Zambesi river in Africa could be made to furnish 35,000,000 horsepower, more than is derived in the world to-day from coal and oil.

An inventor has equipped a glove for motorists with an electric lamp and battery to illuminate a wrist watch when contact points on the thumb and first finger are brought together.

Some Brazilian cities are experimenting with a metric system for numbering their houses, a number indicating that a house is that many meters away from an understood starting point.

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GROTESQUE JOURNALISM

Truth Comments on Control of Editorial Writers

London, Nov. 1.—Alfred G. Gardiner, who has just relinquished the editorship of the Daily News, after 18 years service, is about to pay a visit to the United States, and he informs us that he hopes to visit Montreal and Toronto in the course of his journey.

The retirement of Alfred Gardiner, by a coincidence, happened almost by the same day as Sir Edward Cook, a former editor, breathed his last. Discussing the changes in newspaper life since Cook was actively engaged therein Truth recently said:

"Editorial writers of strong views and independent character find it increasingly difficult today to maintain without compromise their position on the popular morning newspapers. The new school prefer a leading article of a few emphatic and snappy paragraphs to a reasoned appeal; and a leader writer on an up-to-date daily who takes his duties seriously, is perceptibly conscious of an unsympathetic atmosphere. He has often also to yield to proprietorial influences.

"It is surprising, in these conditions, that his work deteriorates? Strong and capable men will not accept this position of subservience. The owner of a newspaper has a right to prescribe its policy. He who pays the piper can call the tune. But it is a grotesque situation when half a dozen newspapers owned by one man all and always cry in unison, uttering the same opinions on the same subject at the same time, the only variation being in the manner of expression."

WILL OPEN CAMPAIGN

Lady Astor Will Speak in Plymouth on Monday.

Plymouth, Nov. 1.—Lady Astor's opening speech in the campaign will be delivered on Monday night, when she will be adopted as the Coalition candidate for the seat in Parliament. During the following fortnight she will speak twice nightly, in addition to addressing morning and afternoon meetings.

Lady Astor's brother-in-law, Col. Spender Gray, the Hon. William George Ormsby-Gore, the Rt. Hon. Francis B. Milderay and Commander Williams are among the members of the House of Commons who will come to Plymouth to make speeches in her behalf.

Lady Astor's agent predicted last night that her majority will exceed the aggregate poll of her opponents.
