Toronto. F. G. Wallace, president of the Canadian Lecomotive Company has definitely decided to relinquish office as the active administrative head of the Company in Kingston, Last week be tendered his resignation and at a meeting of the directors in Toronto on Tuesday morning the situation created by his action was seriously considered. The Board insisted on Mr. Wallace retaining office, but granted him six months leave of absence, which is tantamount to acquiescence in his request to be relleved of the work. William Casey, general manager, assumes charge of the Company's affairs. In an interview to day the following statement was

"A meeting of the directors of the Canadian Locomotive Company was held in Toronto today, for the purpose of taking action upon the resignation tendered by F. G. Wallace, president of the Company.

"The Board unanimously insisted on Mr. Wallace retaining office, granting him a six months leave of absence, which he has accepted. 
