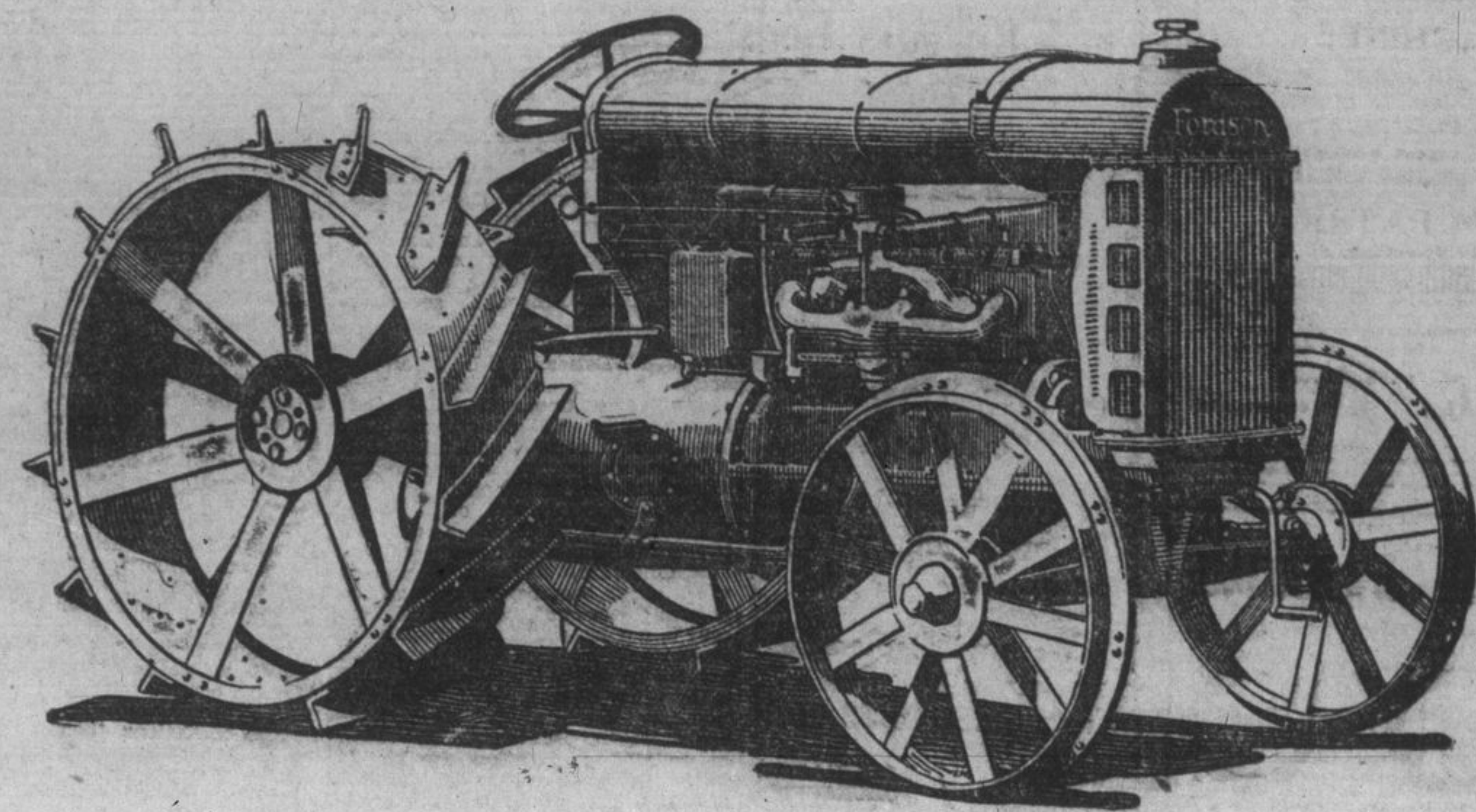
A HALLOWE'EN PARTY
