## LET US STAND BY CANADA INCIDENTS OF THE DAY

### WAR NOT OVER TILL CANADA'S COMMITMENTS ARE FULLY MET

Col. C. C. Williams Speaks to a Large Audience in The City Hall on the Victory Loan.

"The war is not over until Canada's commitments are fully met." This was the declaration of Col. C. C. Williams before a large audience in the City Hall assembled on Friday evening to hear addresses on the Victory Loan.

Col. Williams dealt in a decisive manner with arguments of those who withheld their support to the Loan and showed that, from every sense of duty and patriotism, every person who was able to do so should buy Victory Bonds in order to help bridge over the period between the conclusion of hostilities and the re-establishment of industrial prosperity.

He also dealt with the investment feature of the Loan and showed that in addition to the duty that rested upon every one to support it, it appealed to safety, first persons by reason of the absolute security it offered. Nor was this all for there was always the reward of "bread cast upon the waters," and he told how the faith of Isabella of Spain in Christopher Columbus was rewarded far beyond her dreams by the discovery of America, a new world.

"Five and a half per cent." means a job for every laboring man and the continued prosperity of Canada. The person who refused to buy bonds when he was able to do so had no faith in his country and was not willing to do his share to keep faith those who had sacrificed their all. Besides he was turning down real money, for the bonds represented gold.

In concluding he made a strong appeal for the support of the hearers to the Loan. It was Canada that asked for the money not the United Government or Conservative Government. Canada had obligations to discharge by reason of her wholehearted effort in the war and it was the duty of every citizen to do all in his or her power to enable the Government to meet its commitments.

During Col. Williams' address the lights went out to which he made good natured reference bringing forth applause.

J. M. Hughes, ex-mayor, presided and before calling upon the speaker of the evening he extended a hearty welcome to the audience. He told of the progress made since the Victory Loan campaign started. Kingston and Frontenac had raised \$2,550,000 and up to to-night the amount subscribed was \$1,838,000. He left it to Col. Williams to tell why the money was needed and he called upon H. C. Nickle who gave a stirring address, presenting many facts connected with expenditures under the heading of soldiers' civil re-establishment, vocational training and war service gratuity.
