HOLLAND IS NERVOUS

Fears Spread of Revolutionary Trouble in Germany.

The Hague, Nov. 12.—In spite of the fact that the passenger traffic of Germany is practically suspended, the Dutch are obviously getting extremely nervous, fearing the spread of possible revolutionary trouble across the German border and have strengthened their guards on the eastern frontier. While the suspension of passenger train service in Germany, which is as much a political as an economic measure against the revolution celebrations, is a relief to Holland, it has greatly affected the economic relations and blocked all postal, telegraphic and telephonic communications.

To Come to Penitentiary.

Parry Sound, Nov. 12.—This morning Leo Mishaw, of Penetang, and David Mishaw, alias David Gardner, of Shawanaga Bay, this district, were sentenced in the Police Court, by Police Magistrate George Moore, for breaking into fifteen or twenty summer cottages at Point-St-Haril and elsewhere, and of wholesale stealing.

Leo Mishaw was given a term of three years and nine months in Penetang penitentiary, and David Mishaw was sent to penitentiary for two years and three months.
