G.W.V.A. Notes.

There are now 212 branches of the G.W.V.A. in Ontario, with 44,860 paid-up members. Ninety-eight branches have been organized since January, 1919.

The provincial secretary, organizing secretaries and members of the Ontario provincial executive have made 329 visits to the various branches.

The Ontario provincial command has satisfactorily settled \$68 claims for pensions, post-discharge pay, back pay and other things.

Arising out of the agitation for amendments to the G.W.V.A. constitution, all members in Ontario will be given an opportunity to vote on the following questions:

1. Are you in favor of amending the constitution to permit political action?

2. Are you in favor of amending the constitution to permit any person who has served honorably in the forces of Great Britain and her Allies to become members of the G.W.V.A.?
