TO ATTEND POWER MEETING

OF EASTERN MUNICIPALITIES AT BROCKVILLE ON MONDAY

R. F. Elliott, Mayor Newman and J. M. Campbell to Represent Kingston—This City Should be Represented on Ontario Power Commission.

There will be no meeting of the Utilities Commission on Monday, as a meeting of the Eastern Ontario municipalities has been called to take place at Brockville on that day.

Many important matters will be discussed, and it is not unlikely that the question of a representative on the Ontario Commission will be recommended. Brockville and other eastern points have not, as yet had the advantage of the experience of Kingston in the administration of municipal utilities, and Kingston is expected to provide the first Hydro-Commissioner from this end of the province by reason of the intensely practical experience gained in the work here during the past ten years.

J. M. Campbell, president of the Board of Trade, is an electrical expert and head of Campbell Power Company. He would also be a valuable member of the Commission.

ACTION TO RECOVER THE SUM OF \$46,000

Heirs of W. H. Comstock Bring Lawsuit Against recent Directors National Mfg. Co.

Brockville, Dec. 6.—A suit is pending which will create considerable local interest. Writs have been issued by Alice Janet Comstock, Kate L. Cositt, W. H. Comstock, and Henry Gates, executors of the late W. H. Comstock, against the recent directors of The National Manufacturing Company, Limited, namely: George Ira Mallory, James Alexander Hutcheson, Frederick C. Mulkins and F. Craig.

The action is to recover certain monies amounting approximately to \$46,000, which were loaned to Gordon Delahaye, K.C., for the purpose of purchasing the stock of some local shareholders who were desirous of disposing of their holdings of preferred stock in the National Manufacturing Company, Limited.

The law, according to the Ontario Companies Act, enacts that no company may loan money to a shareholder. Mr. Delahaye was the owner of a few shares of stock at the time the loan was made, and the Comstock estate is suing to cause the defendants to be compelled to put these monies back into the coffers of the company.
