BUSINESS MEN AS CANDIDATES

(Continued from Page 1.) 900, and it now stood at \$2,229,000. He said the situation called for great wisdom and the strictest application of business principles. The city could prosper only by the combined efforts of the business men as their best judgment was needed, particularly on the finance committee.

Back Their Candidates. Ald. W. P. Peters said he was glad to see so many business men present. He believed that they should rise and get behind their candidates for mayor, the utilities commission and aldermen and elect them. He was strongly of the opinion that there should be a contest for the mayoralty as H. C. Nickle's relation to the street railway was a positive bar to his election as mayor.

The committee that had been appointed to draw up a list of candidates presented its report. Some of the present aldermen were included. W. Y. Mills stated that he only entered the council last year upon the earnest solicitation of business men and he would be glad if another were chosen in his stead.

At the outset it was definitely decided that political considerations should not enter into the selection of candidates, and although many present were formerly prominent in local politics, there was a decided inclination to abide by the policy adopted as being in the best interest of the city. The proceedings were marked by the utmost unanimity showing that when business men get together for a common object they can accomplish a great deal in a comparatively short space of time.
