To Refund the Money. Passage money paid by soldiers' dependents who returned to Canada from England prior to the signing of the armistice will be refunded by the Dominion Government.

Heavy Fines Imposed. Mrs. Agnes MacVickers, landlady of the Marrigan house, Deseronto, entered a plea of guilty to a charge of keeping liquor for sale and was assessed \$90 by the magistrate. The bar-keeper of the Marrigan house was fined \$200 for selling liquor on Sunday, Nov. 30th, and fined \$300 more for selling on Wednesday last.

Died at Allison, Ont. There passed away at Allison, Ont., Rev. George F. Lee, aged eighty-five years and seven months. Mr. Lee was brought up in the township of Kingston and was ordained as a minister of the Methodist church in 1889. After 90 years of different events he superannuated in 1895, settled in Allison where he was called to the church triumphant on Nov. 29th last.

Remanded for Week. At Brockville on Monday a young man was taken into custody by Inspector J. J. Graham, of the Dominion police, and Chief Burke, charged with being a defaulter under the Military Service Act. Later he appeared before Magistrate Page and was remanded for a week. Bail to the extent of \$2,000 was accepted. He gave his own bond for \$1,000 and a surety in Thomas Hare for \$1,000.

A Successful Tea Meeting. The Crosby Methodist church celebrated its annual gathering on December 4th, by an old-fashioned oyster supper which proved a great success. The church was literally packed with an eager, expectant crowd who thoroughly enjoyed the programme. The chair was taken by the pastor, Rev. W. G. Bradford. Practically 400 people including children were on hand and the proceeds were \$178, going "over the top" of anything known before.

WHOLE FAMILY FAINTED Baby Had a Fit and Harrowing Events Followed. New York, Dec. 10.—"The whole family is dying; send some help," was the telephone message received at the Balthasar street station Brooklyn, yesterday. The owner of the agitated voice was Abraham Davis, of No. 280 Sumner street, Brooklyn. An automobile was called from the Bushwick hospital to the Morse home and Dr. Arnovitz learned that the trouble began when Carl Morse, one-year-old, sprawled on the floor in a fit at 280 Sumner street. The child's mother, Bessie, appalled by the sight, fell in a faint. Drawn by the sound of the fall, the father, Abraham, twenty-six years old, ran into the room, cried out and dropped unconscious. An aunt of the infant, Mrs. Annie Deguid, entered next. She screamed and fainted. Then came another aunt, Miss Jennie Day, and collapsed at the sight of the prostrate family. Her brother, Abraham Davis, was attracted by the sound of screams and calls. He ran, but did not faint, and hurrying out, telephoned the message to the police. All the members of the family recovered after treatment by the ambulance surgeon.

SECURING MILITARY DATA FOR BOARD WHICH MEETS HERE ON FRIDAY

The Sixteen Platoon Battalion is likely to be adopted as the most mobile and effective. Lt.-Col. W. B. Brown, D.A.A. and Q.M.G., is engaged upon the work of compiling information respecting the reorganization of the militia units in this divisional districts. The chief object of the Board that has been appointed to bring in a recommendation to the Militia Council, is to so organize the forces of Canada that they will represent the last work in co-ordination and efficiency as taught by the experience gained in the late great war. It is generally recognized by the military authorities that this will necessitate a complete departure from the old regimental organizations and the substitution thereof of the sixteen-platoon battalion. This was found to be the most mobile and effective. Every part of the C.E.F. battalion was an effective organism, inasmuch as the smallest section was capable of independent action and was not hampered in any way of dependence upon other sections. For instance in the rural districts where a full battalion or company cannot be raised, platoons can be organized and trained that could take their place in any battalion and in this way it is possible to have a greater number of men in training than it was formerly under the old system. The old system did very well at the start of the war, because the organization was in existence. That made it possible to raise the first contingent in a remarkably short space of time, but after that the raising and training of additional troops was a very different thing. Col. Brown will have his data ready for submission to the officers and the members of the Board on Friday next.

TERMS OF AGREEMENT Between Government and the Patriotic Fund Committee.

Ottawa, Dec. 10.—The agreement entered into between the Government and the patriotic fund committee provides as follows: 1. The Government will be represented on the organization of the patriotic fund at Ottawa as well as on each provincial organization. 2. Representatives of returned men will be attached to local committees dealing with the problem. 3. Assistance is to be given only because work is not available. Before making any payment the organization will secure a necessary certificate in each case showing that the applicant is unable to find employment.

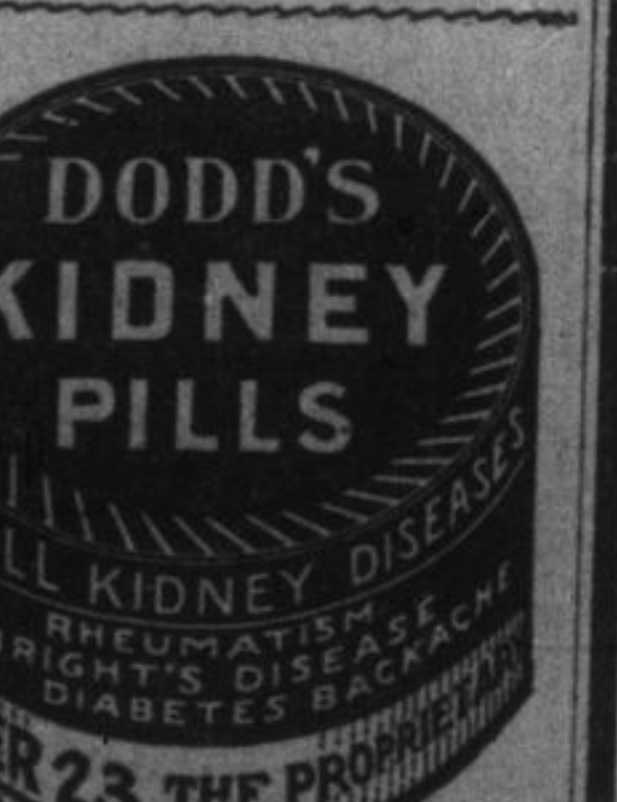
