Woeful Prices For Poultry. Wednesday and Thursday were turkey fair days in Perth and the prices were woeful to put it mild. On Wednesday turkeys sold at from 47 cents per pound and on Thursday reached, 51 cents. The top price for geese was 35 cents and for chickens 40 cents. Ten years back turkeys were sold at 18 to 20 cents, geese 13 and 13 % cents and chickens from 13 to 17 cents. Those were the good old days, says the Courier.
