

Its Many Advantages and Attractions

Reasons Why the City of Kingston is Prospering, Why
It will Continue to Prosper and Why It Should
Attract New People

- 1st Kingston is situated more advantageously, perhaps, than any other city in Canada for manufacturing purposes and should appeal especially to American manufacturers seeking to locate in Canada. At the foot of Lake Ontario and the head of the famous St. Lawrence River, it is but a stone's throw from the American side, while its extremely central location is emphasized by the fact that one can board a train at Kingston any afternoon and be in Toronto or Montreal before six o'clock that evening, or in New York, or Chicago, or Boston at 8 o'clock the following morning, ready for business. To the American Capitalist looking for a likely Canadian site, this central position of Kingston should appeal fully as strongly as to the Canadian manufacturer.
- 2nd We have reasonably cheap power here and we have plenty of available factory sites at low prices, while the city itself is prepared to deal generously with new industries in the way of guarantees, bonuses and exemptions.
- 3rd For such industries as desire soft coal, Kingston has peculiar and decided advantages, the easy accessibility of the American ports, such as Oswego, Sodus and Charlotte on Lake Ontario by steamers from Kingston, being an outstanding feature and reducing materially the cost of transportation.
- In point of general transportation facilities, the city is very fortunately situated. Not only has it a magnificent water front with lake and river boats in constant service, but it has the three great railroads of the country running through here—the C.P.R., the Grand Trunk and the Canadian National System.
- 5th With the completion of the deepening and enlargement of the Welland Canal and the new harbor improvements in Kingston itself, which the Dominion Government is to carry through, the transportation facilities by water will be better than ever, and should aid materially in stimulating industrial growth here.

- In respect of its educational advantages, the city is well entitled to boast. Not only has it many fine private and public schools, a high-class Collegiate Institute, and a Business College; but here are situated Queen's University with its arts, science, medical, theological and other departments; the Royal Military College, whose graduates did such wonderful service in the great war; and the Regiopolis College which is doing effective service in its line.
- The climate of the city is healthful and health-giving. The Winter season is much as in other Canadian cities, but in the summer, Kingston has a marked advantage over other cities in that it is always cool and pleasant here, thanks to the refreshing breezes from the lake.
- 8tl In point of natural beauty the city cannot be surpassed, ince it is built upon the shores of the lake and the mouth of the noble St. Lawrence, whose famed 1000 Islands are the Mecca for so many tourists.
- 9th For those who delight in outdoor sports, there is no befter place to be found in Canada than Kingston and the immediate vicinity. Bass fishing, Salmon fishing and maskilonge fishing can be had throughout the season, both in Lake Ontario and in the innumerable lakes immediately back of Kingston in Frontenac County of which Kingston is a part; big game—deer and beaund small game such as duck and partridge may bounted in and about these back districts; the new gold inks of the Cataraqui Golf and Country Club adjold glake Ontario Park, should satisfy even the most astidious golf devotee; while the opportunities for yachting and boating of all kinds are unequalled.
- 10th With the completion of the National Highway between Toronto and Montreal, Kingston will be on the direct line and, situated as it is midway between Toronto and Montreal, it will be the Half Way House, so to speak, and a principal stopping point. The superb New York State roads can be reached in little more than an hour's travel from here by boat to Cape Vincent, N.Y.; or by road to Gananoque and ferry to Clayton, N.Y., consuming about the same time.
