WILHELM HAS GROWN FAT. Trembling of Arm and Leg Is Noticeable. Berlin, January 9.—The Hague correspondent of the Tageblatt gives a rather unusual picture of the former German Emperor in a lengthy article regarding the personal appearance of the former ruler and his future prospects.

Wilhelm Has Grown Fat. The Kaiser himself—the Kaiser grows much older—has been struck in his vital strength," says the correspondent. "The trembling of the right arm and leg, which earlier was only just noticeable, has so increased that it is apparent at a glance and dominates his entire appearance. The Kaiser has become very corpulent, though he eats little."

Having talked with countless persons who have visited the former Emperor, the correspondent precedes his picture with a story of criticism of some of the leading personal qualities, who "afterwards tell amusing stories and stories based on misunderstanding which circulate about the world."

He adds: "The Kaiser's attitude is still soldierly, but he appears to have grown shorter. It is noticeable how slowly he speaks in contradiction to his old habit. He lives up only when remembrance of what days come to him. This often occurs in the middle of a conversation. Only pity can be felt for the Kaiser on such occasions. No one who has seen him at Amerongen is capable of responsible impression believes that this man, who is spiritually torn and shows in his body, will ever play an active role in any form whatsoever. By the grinding experiences of war, the blow of a breakdown and worry about his future, which constantly torments him, the deeper impulses of his will are dulled."

In the opinion of the correspondent, the former Emperor has purchased Doorn House as proof that he has given up all thoughts of returning to Germany. "He no longer expresses the wish to return to Germany," says the writer. "He believes Germany is lost. More than ever, he believes he has been betrayed by his councillors and the whole people."

The former ruler's letters are considered by the Dutch, who are declared to be inconsiderate and not naturally severe. The correspondent makes an appeal for the former Emperor, saying: "It depends upon Amerongen being left quiet and forgotten. The last affront that threatens its resident can thus be most easily avoided."

CLAIMS DISFIGUREMENT. Woman Sues Beauty Doctor for \$50,000 Damages. New York, Jan. 8.—Charging that she was recently disfigured by W. Augustus Pratt, face surgeon, of No. 40 West Thirty-fourth street, Mrs. Rosa Williams filed suit yesterday in the county clerk's office for \$50,000 damages. Pratt is described in the papers as a beauty doctor.

In her papers, filed by O'Gorman, Battle and Vandervere of 321 West Street, Mrs. Williams alleges that she answered an advertisement of Dr. Pratt in which it was stated that he could beautify the face by removing double chins and by the contraction of artificial noses. She alleges she visited the office of Dr. Pratt and after paying him a fee of \$50, underwent an operation for the reduction of her chin. Two scars on her cheeks, are the result of this operation, she alleges.
