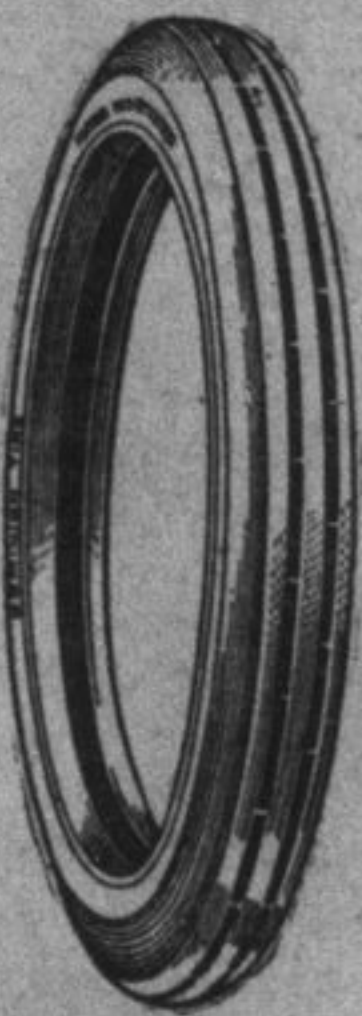

THE MAYOR'S INAUGURAL

URGES CO-OPERATION FOR THE SECURING OF INDUSTRIES.

Tells the City Council What He Would Like to See Done During the Year 1920.

Mayor Nickle delivered the following address at the inaugural meeting of the city council Monday morning:

Gentlemen:
We are assembled to-day under unique circumstances the council being composed of aldermen endorsed by the returned soldier, Labor, business men, and there are also members who were not endorsed by a special faction, yet have the honor of having the confidence of the electors. It is only right and proper and in the best interest of the community that there should be such representation so that there can be

so that every opportunity may be given a pupil to enter the halls of a college or university.

Memorial—Kingston's record during the war is such that she has much to be proud of in her contributions of men, money and munitions. Some of her sons will never return and as time passes those who were more fortunate and have been spared to return will pass to the great beyond, and it would seem fitting that Kingston, which has so well been represented at the front, should erect a memorial in their honor. I suggest that the windows in the city hall be of a memorial type, that brass tablets be erected between the columns and that a record be kept of those who enlisted from Kingston.

Industrial Situation—During the past few years, the leading industries of Kingston, the Shipbuilding Company, the Canadian Locomotive Company, the Davis & Sons Ltd., the Moulding Company and the Dominion Textile Co. and other industries have expanded in a very satisfactory manner.

As to the Future.
There are three essentials necessary for successful manufacturing. Transportation, Labor and Power.

In the first respect Kingston is excellently situated, having the three great trunk roads as well as water transportation.

In common with the rest of the world Kingston has had its labor troubles, and, for the good of the city, employers and employees should endeavor to come together and settle their differences.

Our Utilities Commission has handled the power situation in an excellent manner and it is hoped that in the next few years, power rates will be equated so that Kingston will enjoy power at a rate as low as any other municipality in Eastern Ontario.

With every prospect of Great Britain granting a preferential tariff in favor of the overseas dominions, United States manufacturers will probably erect factories in Canada to handle the export business and every effort should be made so that this city should secure a fair share of this business.

There should be active co-operation between the industries committee of the city council and the Board of Trade and means should be devised for getting in touch with all manufacturing concerns who purpose locating in Canada.

Hospital and Medical College—The following resolution was passed at a meeting held in the Board of Trade rooms, December 15th, 1919:

Resolved—That it is the sense of this meeting of the members of the Board of Trade and citizens of Kingston that every effort should be made to retain Queen's Medical College in Kingston for the full medical term, and that the citizens here pledge themselves to render all possible assistance to assure this desired end, and urge upon the city council the necessity of extending such financial assistance as may be necessary to accomplish this purpose; that a joint committee be composed of the finance committee of the city council and the council of the Board of Trade be charged with the prosecution of the matter; and that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the special committee of Queen's trustees, now dealing with the question, and also to the city council.

This is one of the most important matters that will come before you for consideration during the year and is deserving of careful thought and consideration by the members of council and citizens in general.

Every effort should be put forth to finance within the budget and I am quite confident that if you will consult with the officials in the different departments this can be accomplished. As your presiding officer I ask for your hearty co-operation, and hope you will abide by the rulings of the chair and that your debates will be governed by the rules of council.

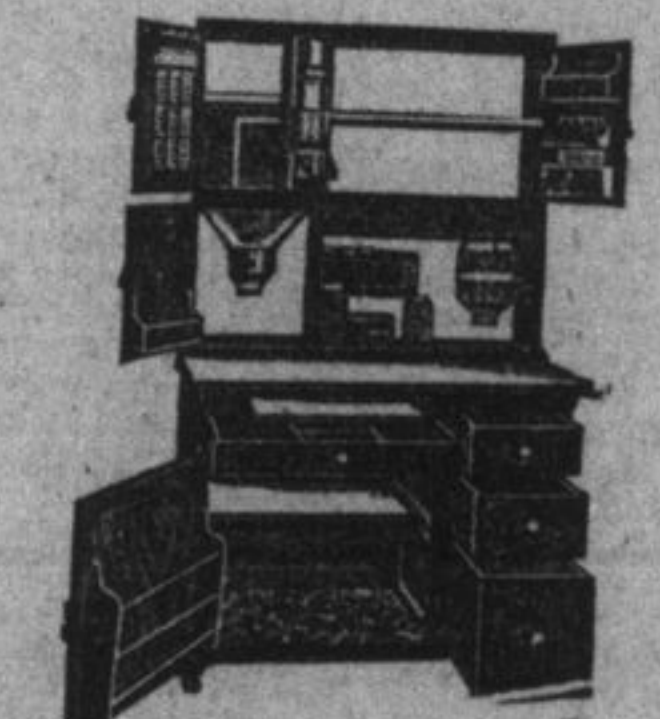
