Postponement in Others Regarding Teachers' Qualifications. Notice is being sent out by the Department of Education regarding the qualification of teachers. Regarding relaxation in the rules, and the an-

nouncement is: "Section 1 of the amendments to "Section 1 of the amendments to the regulations of 1918 is hereby amended to provide that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in said regulations, a High school assistant's certificate, interim or permanent, regularly issued under the present or any former regulations of this department, shall qualify the holder for the position as assistant in any High school, collegiate institute or Grade A continuation school."

The second change is a postponing of certain regulations regarding Public schools. The change reads: "Section 24 of the amendments to the regulations of 1918 is hereby amended by the substitution of the year 1924 for the year 1920," and "Section 25 (1) a and b, of the amendments to the regulations of 1918 are both amended by the substitution of the
