**AIM TO RAISE \$2,000**

By Means of "Bottle Banks" For Victorian Nursing.

The executive committee of the Kingston branch of the Victorian Order of Nurses, this year requires \$2,000 for its laudable work and aims to raise that amount by means of "bottle banks," which will be distributed to all householders in the city. This is a unique way of raising money, and should appeal to the people. The "bank" is in the form of a bottle-shaped card, in which are holes for ten-cent bits. Receivers of the "banks" are asked to fill them themselves or get their friends to add them in so doing. Later on the "banks" will be collected.

The work of the Victorian Order of Nurses is undenominational and all classes are interested in it. Last year the nurses made 2,835 visits and 909 babies were brought for free examination to the Child Welfare Station, which is under the Victorian Order. Social service work is also done by the order. The appeal for funds is one that should commend itself to everyone.
