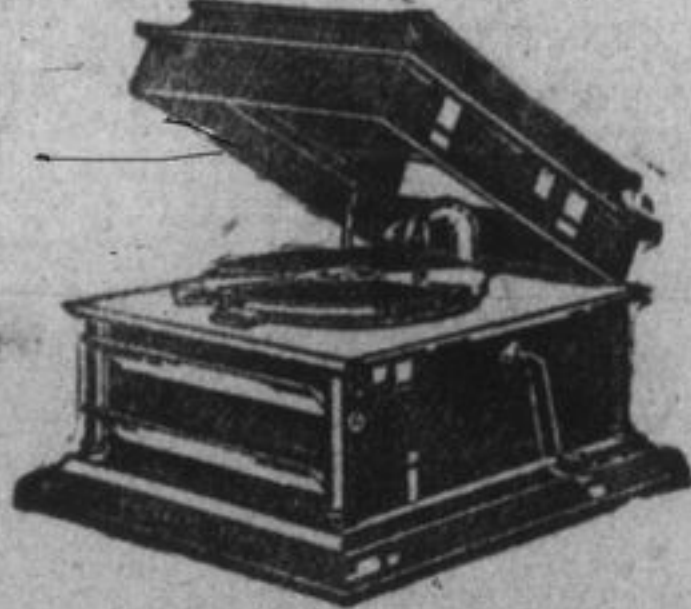

Boys of Australia Take to Athletics

The boys of the public schools in America and also the smaller colleges have been making great strides in athletics the past dozen years, but they do not begin to have the enthusiasm for this line of sport in comparison with the populations at the school boys of Sydney, Australia. At the twenty-fifth annual track and field championship of the public schools of New South Wales recently, a Chicago man saw some of the best athletic events among school boys seen in many a day.

Not only was the enthusiasm great among the boys participating, but there were over 35,000 persons in attendance. The meeting lasted two days. The quality of the young athletes, who ranged from 13 to 17 years of age, was of the very highest. They participated in all the track events and field events known to the American school boy. It can easily be judged as to their ability by the time made in some of the dashes.

One little fellow, P. J. Heath, ran the final in the 100 yards in ten seconds flat—2 number of the heats were run in 10 2-5 and 11 seconds. This is remarkably good time for school boys. The 220 yard race was won in 23 1-5 seconds, and a 15 year old boy won the 220 yards of that class in 24 seconds.

In the 120 yard hurdles, the distance was covered by a youngster named W. Edwards in 16 2-5 seconds. The mile run was won by Law Rutherford, a 15 year old boy, in 5 minutes 4 seconds and the 440 yard race was taken by a little fellow named McFaden, in 53 seconds flat. In the shot put D. G. Manro won with a record put of 39 feet 8 inches. This was for the 12 pound shot and a 15 year old boy won it. These games are held annually at the big Sydney cricket ground where the seating capacity is for over 50,000 people.

SPORTS BOOMING AGAIN IN ORIENT. Athletes from China, Japan, the Philippines and other far eastern countries may be contenders for honors at the seventh Olympiad, to be held at Antwerp next August, and for a certainty will be formidable contenders at succeeding Olympiads, so keen has become the interest fostered by the Y.M.C.A. in these countries.

In China, particularly, the interest in American athletics has caused a demand to come from all parts of the great new republic for a native national amateur athletic association.

R. A. Leake, physical director for the "Y" at Poochow, China, reports that "the need for this has grown during the last few years owing to inter-sectional athletics and China's participation in the far eastern Olympics, held at Manila. On the occasion of the assembling of the Chinese team of more than 100 picked men at Manila, it was decided to make a start toward organizing such a federation.

A committee was appointed to draft and present such a constitution and by-laws. This has been done, and it has been distributed for correction and criticism. The completion of the organization certainly will be effected during the coming year."

A great rivalry in American athletics has sprung up between China and Japan since the Chinese athletes outpointed the Japanese in the far eastern Olympics last summer, although the meet was won by the Philippine islanders.

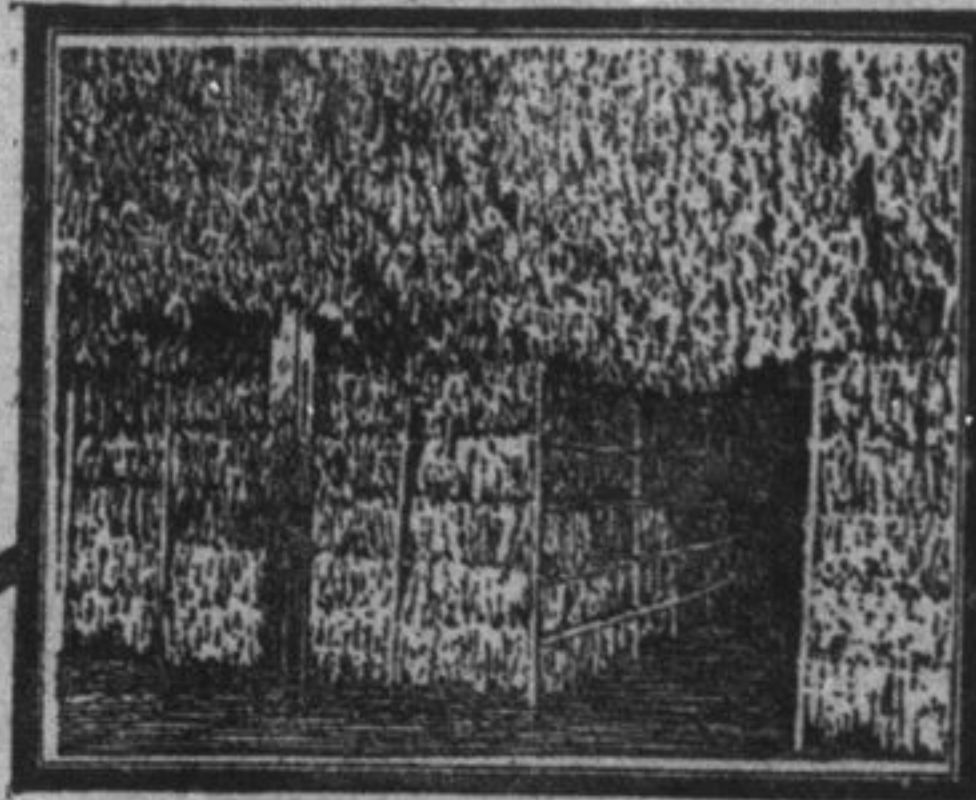

China has taken the hint from Japan, and an Oriental Johnnie Nilsson may appear on a sport programme in the not distant future.

The American swing and the American "pep" are rapidly being acquired by the far eastern athletes, who are getting down to a real training basis.

Baseball, football and basketball, in addition to track and field sports, are rapidly growing in popularity in many parts of China. John Bradshaw, physical director of the "Y" at Amoy, China, writes: "The basketball league has proved a splendid success. Large crowds have attended the games and a great deal of interest has been shown, so that even the middle schools have taken up this sport."
