GAS OIL PRICES RAISED

JUST AS UTILITIES COMMISSION REDUCED GAS RATE.

Must Carefully Nurse the Department—A Minimum Gas Rate Likely to be Fixed.

General Manager Folger informed the Public Utilities Commission on Monday afternoon that the gas department would require careful nursing this year on its reduced rate of \$1.35 a thousand cubic feet. Since the commission made a ten per cent. reduction at the close of last year, gas oil has risen over twenty per cent. in price, in fact it is impossible to get a company to take a contract for the supply of oil at a stated figure. The Imperial Oil Company offered to supply the commission with oil for a year at market prices and this offer was accepted.

In order to cut out unnecessary gas expenditures, Manager Folger is recommending that a minimum rate of fifty cents a month and fifty cents for installing or removing a meter be charged. The commission will deal with this matter at its next meeting. The City Council will be informed that further water hydrants will henceforth be installed upon its guaranteeing to pay the cost of the hydrant and installation. The commission has decided once and for all that it will install no more hydrants free of charge. It takes the ground that it has no more right to install a free hydrant for one customer any more than for another, and the city corporation it regards as merely a customer.

W. J. Crothers addressed the commission and complained that the quarterly water rate for his biscuit factory had risen from \$20 to \$75 a quarter, and he stated that no business extension had taken place. The commission decided to have a government test of the meter made, and if it was found incorrect to make a settlement.

On the recommendation of City Solicitor Whiting, the commission decided to take no action on the claim of Mrs. McCluskey, for damages sustained by her son who, while at play, fell into an open drain, at the noon hour. The commission was asked to pay the doctor's bill of \$25.

Should the Women Preach?

Cole Lake, Ont., Feb. 5.—(To the Editor): You asked the views held by readers as to the scriptural authority for women to preach or teach in public. Your reader thinks they should not. I used to think the same. True, in I. Corinthians, chapter XIV., verse 34, it sounds that way, taking the one verse alone. But that was their law, and even our Saviour taught us to obey the law, but I think St. Paul himself held a different view, for notice his three questions in verse 35: 1.—"What? 2.—"Came the word of God out from you? 3.—"Or came it unto you only?" Also in verse 39: "Forbid not to speak with tongues." Also read St. Luke, chapter II., verses 36, 37 and 38: "The Prophetess Anna departed out from the temple, but served God with fastings and prayers, night and day, and gave thanks and spoke of Him to all that came in." Also Acts, chapter XVIII., verse 26: "Aquila and Priscilla expounded to him the way of God." Romans, chapter XVII., verses 1, 2 and 3: "Phoebe, a deaconess, and Priscilla who is St. Paul's helper." 1st Samuel, first and second chapters, about Hannah's prayers in the house of God, and many other passages. But my main reason for my belief is that God honors the preaching and teaching of women, as shown by the harvest of souls saved. Where would our Sunday schools be if the lady teachers were left out? Again, look at the souls won by the Salvation Army ladies and by other churches that allow women to preach. In I. Timothy, chapter two, you will find the rules in verse nine broken a million times to once in verse twelve, and few people seem to notice it or try to keep those rules. I am a Methodist in religion, perhaps a little old-fashioned, but I would be very interested in hearing the views of readers, with a view to studying God's will, and not for argument.

BATTALION FUNDS HELD BY TRUSTEES

Perth Correspondent Says These Trustees Have Full Power Over the Money.

The Perth correspondent of the Almonte Gazette writes as follows regarding the question recently as to the canteen funds of the 130th Battalion:

"It appears that this canteen fund is not a canteen fund at all but is money received from private and municipal sources.

"The 130th Battalion has to its credit something over \$3,000 in this fund, and when the battalion went overseas the Imperial Government took a hand in it and all the money from all such sources, was returned to Canada, and placed in banks on trust, three trustees having been appointed in each case.

"The trustees for the 130th fund are Messrs. J. A. Stewart, M.P., Judge J. H. Scott, County Judge of Lanark Co. and Mr. P. J. C. MacDonnell, manager of the Bank of Montreal.

"We understand that this money is to be used in assisting the widows and orphans of members of the battalion, but at present the money is on deposit in a chartered bank drawing interest.

"The band instruments, which were purchased from the funds, are securely stored away. This, we understand, is the situation at the present time, but what action will be taken later is in the hands of the trustees and no doubt a report will be made in due time."

SECOND CLASSICAL CONCERT

By Boris Hambourg at Convocation Hall Monday Evening.

The second of Queen's University classical concerts was held in convocation hall on Monday evening.

It consisted of a lecture on the violin, its history and literature by Boris Hambourg, cellist, Toronto. Mr. Hambourg gave demonstrations on his instrument, which he stated was 180 years old, being made at Cremona, Italy, the home of the violin. He described the making of the instrument, and explained why certain kinds of wood were required. His interpretation included the classical, romantic and modern schools of music, and he delighted musical lovers. His technique was faultless and his interpretation marvellous. The hall was packed. Mr. Hambourg was accompanied by Alberto Garcia Guerrero, pianist. The next lecture will include the piano, 'cello and 'violin.

General Williams Visits Hospitals.

On Tuesday morning the patients at the Mowat and Calderwood hospitals were cheered by a visit from Major-General V. A. S. Williams, C.M.G., and his staff. The general, who is keenly interested in the welfare of the sick and wounded returned men, expressed great pleasure with the splendid condition of both these institutions. He was shown through the entire buildings at Mowat, and was loud in his praise of the arrangements for the treatment of tuberculosis. He was accompanied in his visit by Capt. W. H. Smith, assistant director of the Department of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment, under whose supervision these hospitals are operated.
