

FIVE PRISONERS GO TO "PEN" ON STREET CAR

Foreigners Were Brought Down From Cochrane to Serve Short Terms.

Two officers arrived in the city during Tuesday night with five for-eigners for the penitentiary. They spent the night in the police cells, and were removed to the prison on

Wednesday morning.

Owing to the heavy snow storm, King street west was badly blocked with snow, and the officers decided that the best way to get to the penitentiary would be by using the street cars, so they got on a street car with the five prisoners, all of whom were handcuffed. Three were given five years each for burg-lary, and the other two were sent-enced to two years each for indecent
