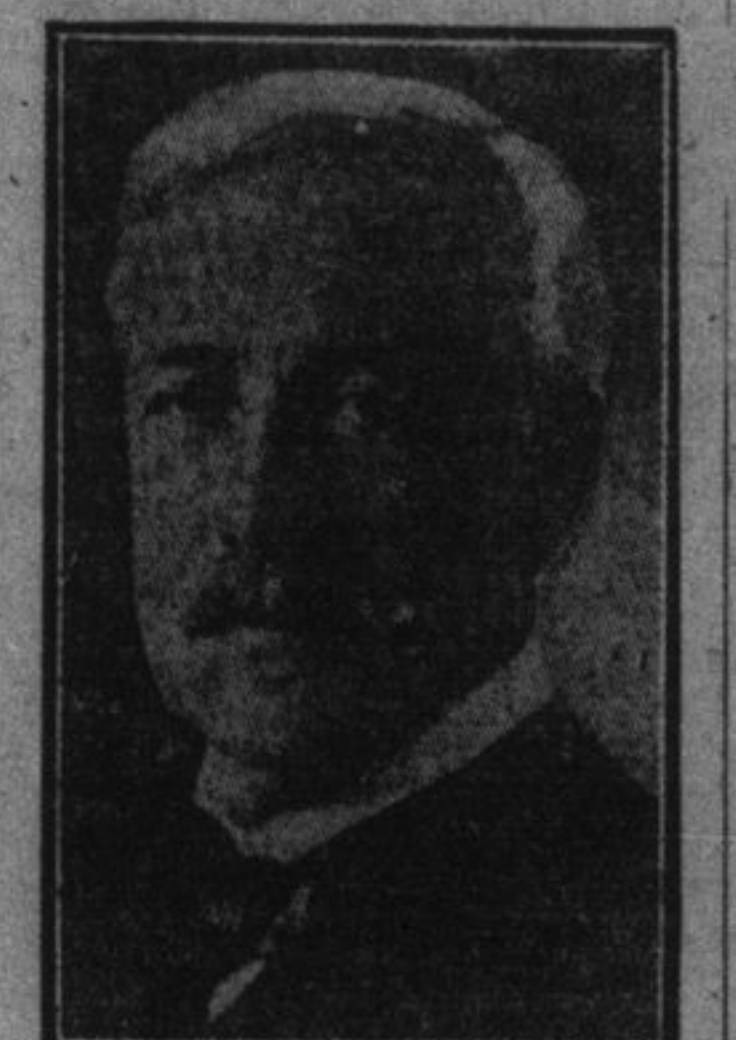

(Canadian Press Despatch) London, Feb. 13.—The latest developments in the Turkish situation have for the moment pushed the Adriatic question into the background in both public and official interest. The reservations which France and Great Britain are said to have made regarding the retention by the Turks of Constantinople, have aroused strong feeling in parliament, where the opposition strongly objects to a settlement of the Turkish question without reference to the Commons.
