Adventurous and Strange Career of Young English Archaeologist Who Led 200,000 And Horsemen Against the Turks - Price of \$500,000 Placed on His Head by the Enemy Who Had Cause to Dread His Genius.

Thomas Lawrence, a young Oxford graduate who had specialized in archaeology. For seven years he had wandered about Syria and other Eastern countries, dressed in native costume and living with the various Bedouin tribes whom he enbreak of the war with Germany he Thomas Lawrence. was engaged in excavation work among the ruined cities of Mesopotamia. He had lived in Arabia so long and had gained such a remarkable knowledge of the various tribes, their language, customs, and peculiarities, that when war was declared the British authorities called him to Cairo and appointed him to the map department of the British Office there, with the title of lieutenant.
