SYDENHAM ST. CHURCH **HAS RAISED \$17,210**

For the Forward Movement-Kingston Presbytery Total Reaches \$72,000.

Sydenham Street Methodist church has contributed the largest sum of any of the local churches towards the Forward Movement financial cam-paign. At the Sunday morning ser-vice, J. M. Hughes, chairman of the finance committee of the Kingston Methodist district, announced that Sydenham street church had raised 17,210, or \$5,210 over the objective.
