**Increase in Price of Sugar.**  
A rise in price of \$2 a hundred on sugar is looked for by the local retailers in the near future, due to the shortage caused by a strike in Cuba.

**Contract for Monument.**

**Parish of Lansdowne Front.**  
The rector, Rev. Cecil Winter, is delighted to report that his parish has slightly exceeded its objective of \$1,200 for the Forward movement. He states that everyone responded nobly to the appeal.

**Was Invited for Another Year.**  
At a meeting of the official board of Trinity Methodist church, Peterboro, Rev. F. E. Malott, B.A., B.D., was invited by a unanimous vote to remain for a third year as pastor of the church. An increase of \$200 in salary was also granted Mr. Malott.

Mrs. Anna Roseboom, widow of George Roseboom, Cape Vincent, N.Y., died at Inverary, Ont., after a short illness of pneumonia. She is survived by her son, Norman Roseboom, employed at Montreal. The body was taken to Cape Vincent and placed in the vault at Riverside cemetery.

**Daughters Get Estate.**  
Mrs. Louise Maria Wilson, Pictou, who died in Toronto in October last, leaves the residue of her estate to her daughters, Jessie Noxon, Mary Eaton and Louise Standish, less certain small bequests and deductions, and the disposal of certain articles and a collection of stuffed birds and other ornaments to relatives. The estate is valued at \$85,700.

**Regret Departure of Manager.**  
At Elgin it was learned with regret that the manager of the Merchants' Bank, K. M. Watson, has been transferred to Masford. The many friends of Mr. and Mrs. Watson in Elgin will gather to present the couple with a well-worned address and a well-filled purse. During their sojourn since 1916, both Mr. and Mrs. Watson filled their place in business and social relations.

**Appointed to Board of Trade.**  
J. C. Rice and J. Allen Stroud have been appointed by the Trades and Labor Council as representatives to the Kingston Board of Trade. The Trades and Labor Council is greatly interested in promoting all measures calculated to benefit Kingston in any way, and the representatives to the board will give their heartiest co-operation in dealing with the problems that come before it for solution. They are both keen for Kingston and will be valuable members.

**PROFITABLE YEAR FOR STANDARD BANK**  
Substantial Gains in Earnings, Deposits and Current Loans.

It is interesting to note that the experience of the Standard Bank of Canada during the fiscal year ending the 31st of January last has been the best in its history. The net earnings of \$776,319 represent a new record. Compared with the previous year, there is an increase of \$78,866. From earnings, the sum of \$455,000 being dividends at the rate of 13 per cent. per annum was paid. The balance carried forward was \$280,637—an amount equal to over 10 per cent. of the paid-up capital of the bank, and in excess of the same item in the statement of the previous year by \$133,210.  
The total assets at the close of January was \$93,405,504—or an increase of \$9,748,539 compared with the previous year. A particularly gratifying item under this heading is an increase of \$1,346,850 in cash (on hand) and quick assets, the total amounting to \$37,412,187, or equal to 45 per cent. of the bank's liabilities to the public. Current loans and discounts at the end of January stood at \$52,463,278 an increase for the year of \$6,369,400. A gain of 10 per cent. has taken place in the deposits—the total amount standing at \$74,019,023, of which \$49,940,378.57 is interest bearing and \$24,078,644.26 is non-interest bearing deposits.  
During the year thirty-seven new branches and sub-branches have been opened throughout the Dominion. The statement is, indeed, a satisfactory one, and indicates that the Standard Bank of Canada, during the year, under review, materially improved its position, net profits and financial strength.

**Patents Worth \$50,000**  
Justice Latchford's decision that the Renfrew Molybdenum Mines, Limited, which operates at Mount St. Patrick, Ont., is entitled to a half interest in patents applied for and secured, which are worth, it is said, \$50,000, has been sustained by the Appellate Division.  
These patents cover discoveries by Charles Spearman, formerly manager of the company's plant, of a process for separating molybdenum. The company claimed to have advanced money for the experiments, and for the application of patents.

**The Late James Pepper.**  
After a short illness the death took place at Lanark of James Pepper, aged eighty-four, a native of Malorytown, who was for thirty-five years proprietor of the Victoria Hotel there. Before going to Lanark he was a farmer in Palmerston township. Deceased was three times married, his first wife being Miss Helen Walker, Ottawa, by whom three daughters survive. His second wife was Miss Mary Parkin, who has four daughters and one son, and his third wife Olivia Henderson, who survives with one son, William Pepper. Lanark, and John Pepper, Belleville, are brothers of the deceased.

**Use Candles at Perth.**  
Owing to the scarcity of water at Perth and for the Hydro system the electric power is turned off about midnight so that the citizens have to resort to lamps and candles.

**Building Material Scarce.**  
Brookville builders and contractors who look forward to a building boom when the snow leaves the ground anticipate difficulty in securing deliveries of building material because of the demand being made upon manufacturers of brick and other material. Members of the housing commission have been in conversation with the director of housing at Toronto but have as yet been unable to receive any assurance that the new government will continue the grants to municipalities.

**Ice Cutting Proceeds.**  
Another week of calm weather will complete the harvest of ice for the New York Central railroad at Cape Vincent, N.Y. About 12,000 tons of ice have been gathered. Like all that harvested throughout northern New York this winter, St. Lawrence river ice is of exceptional quality, the cakes stored for the railroad being unmarred by frozen snow or blemishes and of a distinct blue shade. Some 4,000 or 5,000 tons have been stored in the icehouses at the Cape Vincent terminal and the balance has been shipped to points along the St. Lawrence and Ontario divisions. In the neighborhood of 3,000 tons more will be cut and shipped. Under normal conditions nearly forty cars can be loaded daily.
