C. A. Beal, of Ottawa, the Organizer, Pays a Visit to Kingston-Important Matters Now Being Con-

C. A. Beal, of Ottawa, organizer for the Dominion Retail Merchants' Association, when interviewed the Whig Friday morning, told the practical results obtained by the association during the past year. The bankruptcy law, which has gone into effect, is regarded by bankers and business men as the best Canada ever had. Then there is the fire and liable to penalties meted out to individuals who commit fraud and make the crime of stealing automobiles subject to more severe penalties; making the purchaser of goods on the Sabbath Day equally guilty with the seller; not to prohibit the manufacture and importation of oleomargarine into Canada; amendments to the patent and proprietory medicine act; the appointment of a committee to investigate mail order charges; the appoint-ment of the inland trade commission or board of commerce.

Among the other important matters now being considered by the Dominion government are: Fixing amendments to the adulteration act and false advertising act; removal of the war stamp from patent medicines; to make Thanksgiving Day permanent on Peace Day; a law com-

committee has accomplished wond-ers. He pointed out the desirability of the merchants in every town and city being members of the local or dominion body in order that they may know what is taking place around them, and learn more about the conditions that affect their busi-
