The battery was in command of Capt. "Duke" McCallum, M.C. The civic reception, at which the mayor welcomed the returned soldiers, was given on the Artillery Park square. The streets were lined with peop to greet the men. The unit was to have arrived on the 26th, but on account of the heavy wind which was blowing, the steamer Olympic, on which they came home, was compelled to remain in Halifax harbor for fifty, hours.


