Moscow, April 1 .- The latest survey of the transportation system in Russia show there are 10,000 locomotives in the country, and fiftynine per cent, are unfit for use. In 1914 there were 20,000 with sixteen per cent, out of commission. There are at present 48,500 versts (a verst is two-thirds of a mile) of line in operation, with eight locomotives to each verst; in 1914 there were 63,-000 versts of line operated, with twenty-eight locomotives to each
