She Saw the Coronation of Queen Victoria 82 Years Ago.

To celebrate one's hundredth birthday is not the good frtune of many people and to come to the hundred and fourth mile-stone still able to enjoy life and to be interested in the the women in France, every-day affairs of the community is decidedly unique. Yet up in Grey ounty, near the town of Owen Sound, lives a little old lady who, on January 10, was 104 years of age.

Her name? Why anyone from that
district will tell you of Mrs. Ann
Brown, of The Glen, Sydenham, Grey county's only centenarian, and who is said to be the only surviving witness of the coronation of Queen Vic-

Born in the quaint old village of Topcliffe, in Yorkshire, England, her early days were spent in the quietness and seclusion of the little country town. Her earliest recollection is of her grandfather preparing a feast on the village green for the men of the Topcliffe Company of Regulars, just returned from campaigning against Napoleon Bonaparte in Belgium and France. The first venture from the protecting shelter of her grandfather's cottage was to the great city of London. When a dark-eyed young maid of twenty summers she went to visit her mother in the great city, traveling from Hull in one of the first steamboats. On arriving in London she found that everything was in a state of bustle and excitement in preparation for the coronation of the young Queen. Her step-father was an upholsterer in the employ of the royal family and, to please his shy young visitor from Yorkshire, secured a pass for her into Westminster Abbey to witness the ceremony of the coronation.
On the great day, June 28, 1838, she took her place with hundreds of others inside the Abbey and waited breathlessly for the great event. According to Mrs. Brown the appearance of the Queen was rather dis-appointing. She had been picturing to herself a tall beautiful woman, and instead she saw a girl, two years younger than herself, rather short, and quite ordinary-looking. In 1862 Mrs. Brown made another

journey from her home in Yorkshire to visit the First World's Fair, promoted by PrinceAlbert, Queen Victoria's Consort, and held in the Crystal Palace, London. On the death of her husband in 1863, Mrs. Brown decided that she could better her fortupes in a new land. With indomitable spirit she set out with her five small children for Canada. For three years she resided in Owen Sound. In 1866 she took up 120 acres of land in the township of Sydenham, four miles from Owen Sound. Here she has lived ever since, often under disheartening and difficult circumstances. In spite of the primitive condition of the country she wrested a living from the soil and raised and educated her

During the visit of the Duke of Devonshire to Owen Sound in June, 1918, His Excellency visited Mrs. Brown and chatted with her for some time. She is still quite active, goes about the farm, reads a little, and writes in a clear steady hand. During the war she knitted nearly a dosen pairs of socks for the local branch of the Women's Patriotic League. Her vitality is wonderful, and she has many friends in Grey County who hope that they may be able to congratulate her upon her 105th birth-


