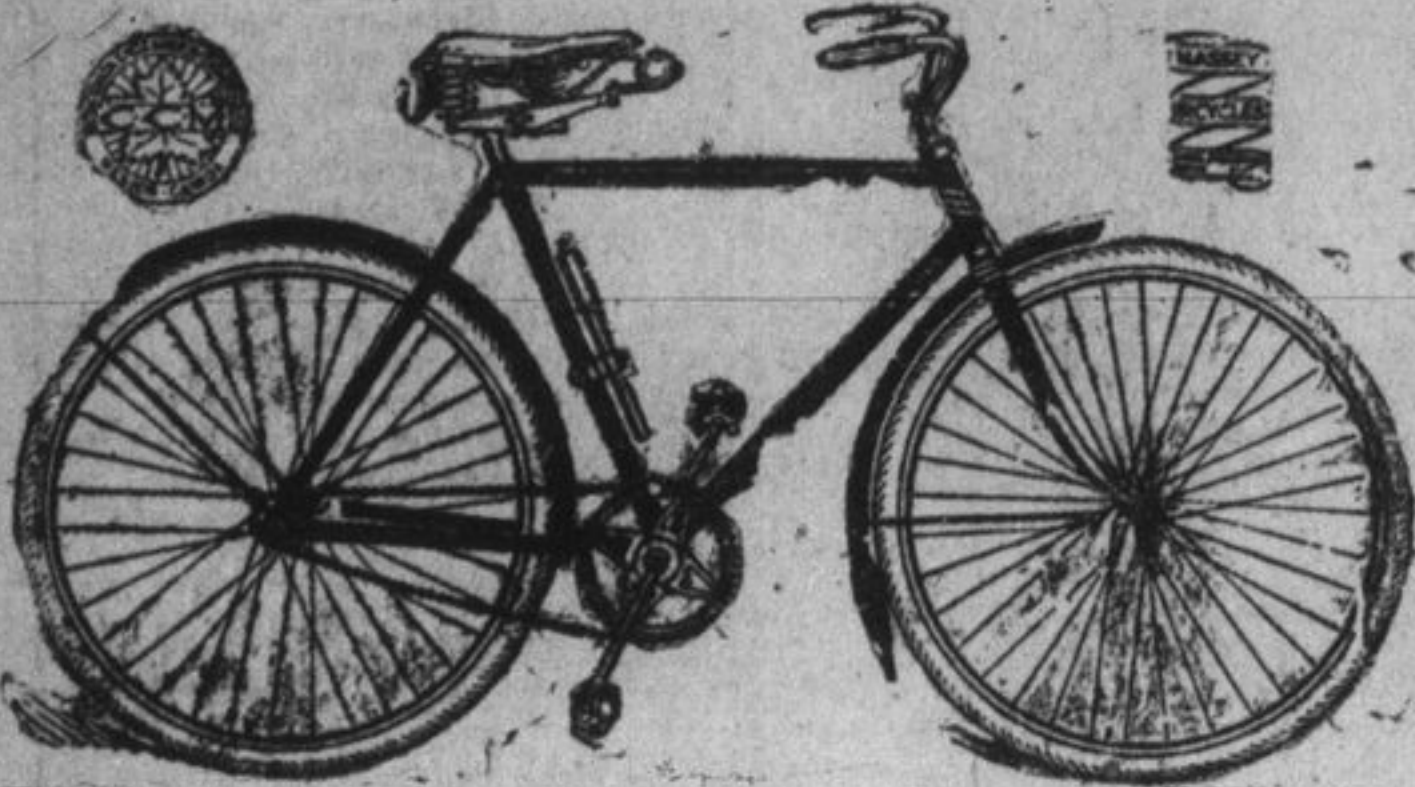

ENGLISH ATHLETES SURE OF SUCCESS

If Oxford and Cambridge do not capture the honors in the University of Pennsylvania carnival on April 30th and May 1st there will be sorrow in the hearts of English university athletes, for Oxford and Cambridge are sending their best to contest for this sporting event. The team which left Southampton aboard the steamship Adriatic of the White Star line comprised the cream of Oxford and Cambridge athletics.

Members of the team are Col. A. N. Storde-Jackson, the Olympic 1,500 metre champion; B. C. D. Rudd, brilliant South African Rhodes scholar and hero of the recent Oxford and Cambridge sports meet at the Queen's Club, where he won the 880-yard run and dead heated for the quarter, the 880-yard run, giving Oxford the victory; A. E. Montague, a speedy Oxford three-miler; H. B. Stallard, and A. W. C. Tatham, Cambridge milers, and W. R. Milligan, who probably will make the pace for Mr. Montague. A. Shrub, trainer, accompanied the team.

W. Mountain, the Cambridge middle distance runner, also was expected to go with the team, but could not leave here in time. As a substitute for him H. M. Abraham, Cambridge sprinter and broad jumper, probably will be selected and may leave England on the steamship Kroonland.

The team is going to the United States at the invitation of the University of Pennsylvania, and is the first university athletic team from England to visit America in seven years, when Oxford defeated Penn by a few inches at Franklin Field.

SAY QUEBEC TRACKS WILL FEEL EFFECTS

Montreal racing men view with some apprehension the race track taxation scheme of the Ontario government.

"If the proposed legislation is put into operation, many tracks will undoubtedly be forced to close up," said a Montreal racing man. "The clubs simply could not stand it. With the tracks closed, there will not be nearly so many horses coming to Canada from the United States, and there will then be a shortage of the better class of racing material, of which the Quebec tracks will feel the effects."

CANADIAN TEAM TO SAIL ON JULY 24TH

The Canadian Olympic track and field team will sail for Belgium on July 24, on the Melita, the boat that took the Falcons' Canadian hockey champions away.

The provincial trials will be held in Toronto on July 1st. The semi-final contests will be held in Winnipeg on July 10th, and the finals are to be decided in Montreal on July 17th.

All preparations for the Canadians' headquarters and training are being made by W. A. Hewitt, who accompanied the Falcons.

Olympic Hockey Card is Reduced.
The length of time provided in the original Olympic games program for hockey competition has been reduced by half, according to advices received by Gustavus T. Kirby, President of the American Olympic Committee, from the Belgian Olympic Committee. Play, originally scheduled to start April 20 and continue until April 30, will not commence until April 24, and will conclude on April 29.

Dates for the Canadian Olympic semi-final and final trials, track and field, are announced. The Canadian team will be chosen at Montreal after the finals in July and will sail on the Melita on July 24th.

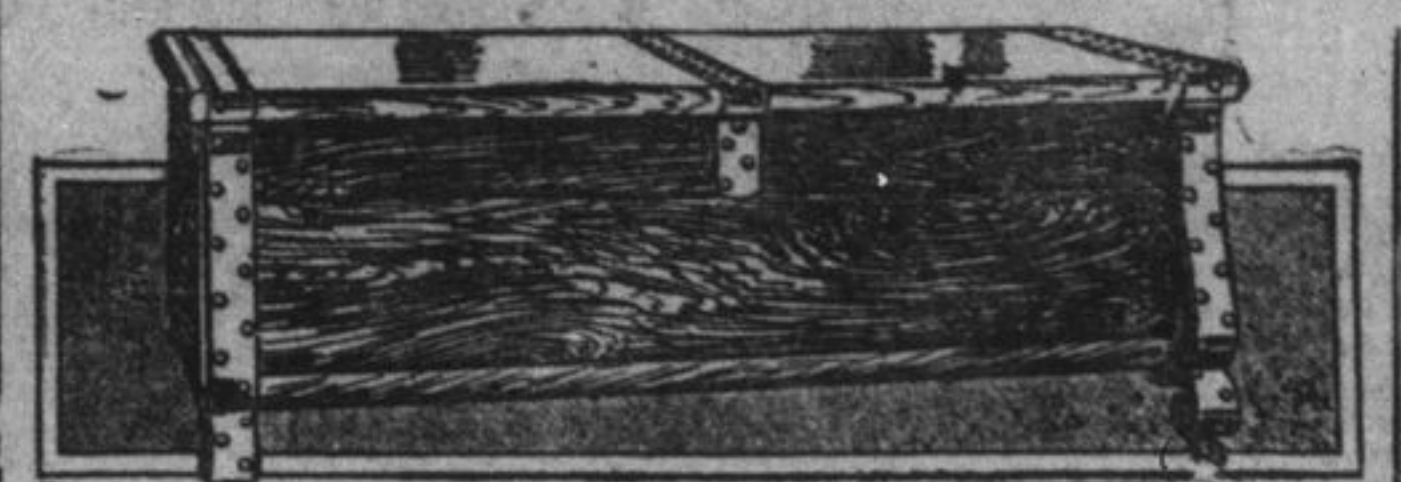

MARATHON RUNNER BORN IN MARATHON

A Marathon runner born in the village of Marathon, the spot which marked the start of the first race of this kind in the modern Olympic revival in 1896, will be one of the curiosities of the Boston Marathon, which will be run next Monday. Pete Trivolidas is the name of the long-distance pedestrian, and he will carry the colors of the Millrose A. A. He is expected to make a first-rate showing, especially as he belongs to a family of long-distance runners and is a relative of Coues, the Greek winner of the first race in 1896. Of course, the real Marathoner was Pheidippides, who in 490 B.C. carried the news of the victory of the Athenians over the Persians from Marathon to Athens and then dropped dead after delivering the joyful news.

Trivolidas has been trained by Pete Hegelman, the old six-day man, who is also schooling Nick Giannakopoulos and Willie Kyronen. The trio, with their trainer, will leave for Boston this afternoon, and they will be given a smell of the course on Thursday. It is understood that the first four men in the Boston race will be taken on the Olympic team to Belgium, and they may be reinforced later on by a few more selections.
