

The features of some score of the lynchers are plainly revealed, so that it would be an easy matter for the authorities to arrest and prosecute the lynchers in this case if they desired to do so. The men are standing round smiling into the camera. The chief assassin is smoking a cigarette. Beside him stands a woman. Two or three of the murderers appear to have donned overalls for the purpose, in order that their clothing might not be spoiled. One looks on the faces and is amazed to find that none of them appears convulsed by hatred or distorted by insanity. Were it not for the ghastly form of the negro on the ground, this group might well have been taken to commemorate a pienie or mark some pleasant social reunion. Most of the lynchers appear to be young men. They are well dressed. Nobody appears to be intoxicated. This crime was committed in the large and imneck to a tree in Lee County, Georgia. the pamphlet is the openness with which the lynchings, for the most part, were carried out. They were announced in the newspapers in advance. Here, for instance, is a sentence from the Jackson, Miss., Daily News, of June 26, 1919: "John Hartfield, the negro alleged to have ashas been taken to Ellisville and is Ellisville to witness or participate in the murder.
