TO CHANGE RACING DATES

Fort Erie and Hamilton May Switch Milton to Start.

While tentative dates have already been announced for the coming turf season in Canada, it is likely that the schedule will be revised slightly. The Canadian Racing Association will meet in the near future, when the meets will be finally allotted. It is not expected that there will be any alterations in connection with the dates given to Connaught Park, which are June 19th to 26th and September 23 to 30, on the Woodbine Track at Toronto. There appears to be some difficulty, however, in connection with the Hamilton and Fort Erie meetings, so they may be switched somewhat.

Everything now points to a great racing season in the Dominion. As soon as the Maryland tracks close next month the majority of the horsemen racing there will ship their thoroughbreds to Canada.

"Jim" Milton, the well-known starter, who is now officiating at the Havre de Grace meeting, will act in that capacity on the Canadian Racing Association tracks. It is announced that Milton will do the starting at the Woodbine meeting May 22, and that he has also been appointed for other Canadian meets under the jurisdiction of the Canadian Racing Association. Mr. Milton succeeds Barret A. Dade, always a big favorite on the Canadian tracks, who is now starting in Kentucky.

REVIVE "COWES WEEK"

Glories of Royal Yacht Squadron to Be Seen Again.

For the first time in seven years there will be a real "Cowes Yachting Week" next August. Many of the schooners and cutters famous in pre-war times will spread their sails again, and the glories of the Royal Yacht Squadron's regatta will be revived.

The celebrated Herreshoff schooner, Westward, purchased by Clarence Hatry, the prominent sportsman whose horse, Furious, won the recent Lincolnshire handicap, is to be put into full racing rig. I understand, the Westward, of 338 tons, was built in 1910 in Rhode Island, and on her first trip to Europe, led the best British and German yacht off Ryde by several miles in one of the big events of 1910.

As-King George is racing Britannia this season and a new 150-ton yacht named Terpsichore is nearing completion, Westward will have formidable opponents, particularly as she will sail in a handicap class. Although Britannia was built in 1893, she is still a fast, powerful yacht. She was designed by the late G. L. Watson of America's Cup fame, and in 1894 defeated the famous American sloop Vigilant in a majority of races.

Westward's most formidable rival will be the Marguerite, the A class schooner designed by Charles Nicholson, ant at present owned by S. B. Joel, multi-millionaire race horse owner. Nicholson is the designer of Sir Thomas Lipton's Shamrock IV, this year's challenger for the America's Cup.

Westward will be commanded by Captain E. Sycamore, who sailed the Earl of Dunraven's Valkyrie III, in the America Cup races of 1895. John R. Payne, famous in yachting circles for many years, will see to the sailing of Westward.

With such a fleet "out" the old glories of Cowes Week will be revived this year with promise of excellent sport. While there will be no German yachts seen off the Isle of Wight next August, it is reported King Alfonso of Spain will bring over a racer or two.
